About our school

River Elm is a public elementary school in Winnipeg, Manitoba. The school is located in the Elmwood Community and enrolls 296 students from nursery to grade six. It is one of 78 schools within the Winnipeg School Division. River Elm offers a variety of English programs and offers basic French for Grades 4-6. River Elm promotes the infusion of Indigenous perspectives and cultural practices within the classroom and school community.

River Elm is a RTI (Response to Intervention) and Restorative Practices based school that provides opportunity for all learners. We also have a Special Education Resource Teacher, Community Support Worker, Home Learning Assistance Community Worker and a Guidance Counselor. We offer a Lunch Program for our students and is supported by our Parent Advisory Council (PAC). There are a variety of after-school programs offered at the school on a daily basis for students and parents.

River Elm supports the Reading Recovery Early Intervention Program, Regie Routman (Writing Process), "Talk to Me" Project (Program for all Nursery and Kindergarten students), Marion Smalls, Number Talks (both support the Math Pathway), Seeds of Empathy (Literacy Based Program) and the Home Reading Program N-6. These are just some of the social skills and academic programs offered at River Elm.

- River Elm Honour Choir performed our national anthem at a Manitoba Moose hockey game.
- River Elm held a fall Indigenous Community Feast.

- River Elm staff harvested the medicine (Sage) that we used for the 2019-20 school year daily Smudge.
- River Elm students took part in the 2019-20 Hockey
 H.E.R.O.S program.
- River Elm staff and students took part in the Orange t-shirt day to support residential school survivors and antibullying.
- 21 Leaders took part in educational school visits.
- Students raised money for the Terry Fox Foundation.
- The 21 Leaders and Learners took part in a communitywide clean up and lead school activity days.
- River Elm Pow wow dancers took part in our school-wide events for the 2019-20 school year.
- River Elm Parent Advisory Council raised over \$ 2000.00 dollars for school-wide initiatives.
- River Elm continued with the Medicine Wheel garden and planted flowers as part of the 2019-20 ESD grant to support our schools Indigenous cultural of learning initiative.
- River Elm staff took part in the Journey's Group series of learning with, Vern Dano.
- River Elm staff and students created a common garden area plan for our courtyard as part of River Elm's ESD plan (currently on hold due to COVID-19).
- River Elm expended the Family Room this year to support families within our community. Average of 10-15 parents attended daily.
