Dr. Trepel will discuss the mental health impact on transgender students and research from the Canadian Trans Youth Study. He will also share medical aspects of transition, services provided by the GDAAY clinic and highlight some specific issues from Supporting Transgender and Gender Diverse Students in Manitoba Schools resource.

Thomas came out as a transman in 2011 while attending university and has been loud and proud ever since.
