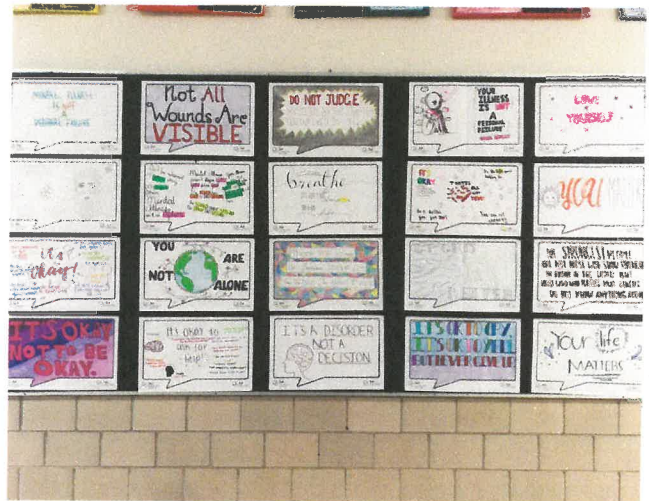

- To further improve school attendance, achievements and graduation rates through the exploration of additional programs and strategies.

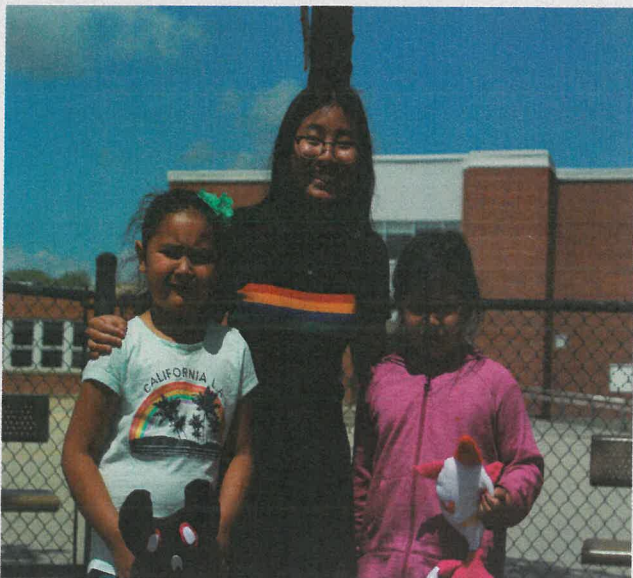
Addressing Barriers to Learning:

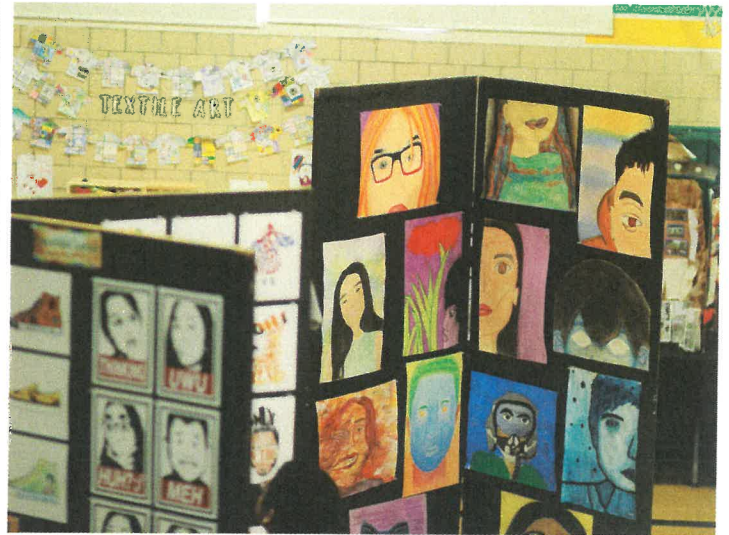
