About Our School

Strathcona School is a Nursery to Grade 6 elementary school located in the heart of Winnipeg's north-end. Our school has an enrolment of 265 students, supported by 21 teachers, a Community Support Worker and 18 auxiliary staff members including educational assistants, clerks and custodians.

We pride ourselves on creating an inclusive educational environment that fosters interactive, innovative and authentic learning experiences. Our students are provided with opportunities to achieve academic excellence, build on their self-esteem and develop social responsibility within a supportive and challenging school context. We offer experiences both in and out of the classroom, which promote tolerance and understanding, self-discipline and independence. We foster an environment where all children feel accepted, valued and individuality is celebrated.

We offer Music, Physical Education, Visual Art and an integration of technology throughout all subject areas. Our school has a wide range of extra-curricular activities such as Intramurals, Pow Wow Club and Family Fiddle Nights. We are a Jets Hockey Academy school, which is a play-based developmental program for students in upper elementary. Students are encouraged to take active roles in a variety of student leadership including patrols, peace-community groups and the Green Team.
