Winnipeg School Division Everybody has the Right Connects with International Storytelling Festival at CMHR United by Stories

April 24, 2017 (Winnipeg, MB) – Students from across Winnipeg School Division (WSD) and participants of the International Storytelling Festival will connect at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights for the finale of the WSD Everybody has the Right (EHTR) program for 2016/17.

The EHTR Human Library events over the past year have helped students consider "identity" from a variety of different lenses as they develop their own sense of who they are. Over two days, students will learn about artifact storytelling with international storyteller Jamie Oliviero and Chris Scholl from DNA Rhythms.

As a finale art piece for the 2016/17 EHTR, students will take part in creating a giant puzzle on the floor of the John & Bonnie Buhler Hall at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights. The puzzle will represent both the individuality and connectivity across Winnipeg School Division.
