ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

Greenway School is an elementary school located in the beautiful west end community

of the Winnipeg School Division. Our school population of 443 students reflects the cultural diversity of the city.

We provide programming for children from Nursery (aged 4 years) to Grade 6 with a 29 full time equivalent teaching staff ratio.

Optimal learning for every child is our primary goal and to help us achieve this, we are a PBIS school,

(Positive Behaviour Interventions and Strategies.) We are committed to providing learning environments that are safe, nurturing, positive and respectful. You will see posted

around the school our motto: Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be a Learner (also known as The 3 B's), as well as common area expectations. The emphasis is on conflict resolution and anti-bullying strategies.

We are a 3rd year Jane Goodall Roots and Shoots school. This means that we lead a year long classroom based student-led inquiry in our community to help the environment, the animals or people. We are very proud of the initiatives that students have worked on.

PRIORITIES AND PROGRESS HIGHLIGHTS for 2019-2020

Strengthen instructional and assessment strategies for all students using all available resources including technology.

- Use of specialty problems that allow for multiple student entry points and conferencing strategies that support children to explain their mathematical thinking and move forward in their numeracy growth
- Specific teacher guidance and feedback to support self selected books that increased engagement in, and time spent reading
- Use of technology to support the Dreambox OnLine Math program
- WSD Support Staff worked with teachers to develop specific targeted literacy and numeracy goal setting.
 For example; students were taught to look at their own work and decide what their next learning steps were
- Focus on reading-writing connections

SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS for 2019-2020

Manitoba Health made the decision to suspend schools effective March 20, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Students continued schooling in an on-line learning format with Zoom plus additional supports through 'SeeSaw', 'Google Classroom', our website, e-mails, phone calls with 'School Messenger' and from teachers to their students, as well as a multitude of home deliveries to provide school supplies, student belongings, and learning materials. And finally, back to school visits in June so that we could prepare for a back to school start up in September. We thank you for your support as we navigated these changes.

Despite this Greenway School had many great highlights this past year. We explored more of what our community would like to see with the planning tool PATH (Planning Alternative Tomorrows with Hope) Community members worked with staff and a facilitator to imagine and then detail the future that the focus aspires to. The team then works backward to what they consider should be the first steps towards achieving the goals. We focused on supporting our community with specialty programming as well as a Breakfast Program. We will be working to continue the momentum.

Evermore's Afterschool program continued four days a week from Monday to Thursday and will extend into the new school year until December. Powwow Club, Filipino Heritage Club and Cultural Art Club started in January and Winnipeg Youth Football Club started again this year for our Grades 4-6 students to participate in flag football at the University of Winnipeg's Axworthy Health & RecPlex Centre.

We continued the fiddle/violin exposure group for our Grade One students. Students who wanted to carry on participated in recess clubs or after-school classes every Thursday. We loved the performance at the Winter Concert!

Our outdoor classroom is doing well and being used regularly. Our new trees are growing nicely and the insect watering garden continues to be an interesting and helpful addition. We continue our work to collect plastic bags, with regular teaching about recycling and composting. Students participated in one community clean-up. Grade 5 and 6 Club 'Greenway Goes Global' Club and our ongoing 'Roots and Shoots' initiative help to make sure we that we maintain a high level of commitment to the environment and to our community.

Sports enthusiasm is on the rise at Greenway with a multitude of before school and lunchtime clubs. Ms. Thomson worked very hard to make sure that students had exposure to all of the sports. Grade 4-6 students had an opportunity to attend a Track Meet at the University of Manitoba.

We are fortunate to have two special education programs here at Greenway, one for students with Autism and one for students requiring adapted skills. All students had a great learning day in February as the Special Education team gave classrooms time to practice to work on various modes of communication.
