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Brock Corydon Hebrew Bilingual Program





Brock Corydon offers a unique Hebrew Bilingual program to students in Kindergarten through Grade 6. Hebrew classes are conducted in Hebrew and many students are proficient in the language by the time they graduate. Students also receive a strong foundation in Jewish culture and traditions in a warm environment that embraces a diversity of practice. We use the TAL AM language program, developed in Montreal, and make use of Hebrew literature, poetry, songs, Torah texts, newspapers, magazines and computer programs as learning tools.

Students celebrate Jewish holidays and learn about the origin and meaning of each holiday and its significance and relationship to the land of Israel. We joyfully celebrate our heritage in many ways, including Sukkah visits, Chanukah candle-lighting ceremonies, Passover seders, Purim carnivals, Yom Ha-atzmaut programs and Shabbat celebrations.

Students also learn about the geography, history and politics of the State of Israel. They examine current events and the effects they have in Israel and the Diaspora.

• Brock Corydon has a sister school in Israel called Ramat Korazim. We have ongoing communication and several joint projects underway.

• Our students participate in community wide events, including the Yom Hashoah program, Yom Ha-atzmaut and Chanukah celebrations.



• Brock Corydon raises funds for various Jewish organizations throughout the year. (JNF, JCFS, etc).

• Older students participate in inter-faith dialogues with students from other faith groups.

• Many of our graduates continue with their Hebrew education by building on the strong foundation they receive at Brock Corydon.
