# **ENQUIRIES AND ANNOUNCEMENTS**

## 50 – School Attendance/Truancy

In response to an enquiry from Trustee Hrynyk pertaining to a previous enquiry about student attendance, the Chief Superintendent drew to the attention of trustees For Information Item No. 6 regarding student attendance in the Winnipeg School Division. The Province of Manitoba has recently distributed attendance results to schools in Manitoba. The Chief Superintendent advised trustees that the average student attendance in the Winnipeg School Division is 92.65% for the 2011/2012 school year, and the overall average in the Province is 93.84%. Trustee Hrynyk requested further information regarding specific schools in the Division that have a lower average than 90% attendance as well as information regarding truancy and the plans to improve attendance and to deal with truancy.

### 51 – Liquor Establishments

Trustee Collins informed trustees that in 2013, the regulatory services for liquor and gaming will be merged into a single agency, the Manitoba Liquor and Gaming Authority. Trustee Collins also informed trustees that she attended the public hearing with the Manitoba Liquor Control Commission and the Manitoba Gaming Commission and it was an informative meeting. Trustee Collins advised trustees that she expressed her concerns at that meeting regarding results of studies which show that crime rates are higher in the vicinity of retail liquor stores and the safety implication for students if these stores are located near schools. The meeting was organized to invite Manitobans to provide their ideas on how they can reduce red tape, improve consumer choice and enhance public safety and social responsibility.

# 52 – Out of Catchment Students

In response to an enquiry from Trustee Wasyliw regarding the Winnipeg School Division School Demographics Report for the 2011/2012 school year, the Chief Superintendent informed trustees that in this report, an inactive student is defined as a student who has left a Division school between October 1<sup>st</sup> and May 31<sup>st</sup>. Trustee Wasyliw also requested further information from administration regarding the procedures that could be taken to collect more thorough data regarding students listed as inactive, the Chief Superintendent advised trustees that the Division takes all the steps possible to obtain the information, however, there is no guaranteed process.

# 53 – Instructional Days

In response to an enquiry from Trustee Babinsky regarding the number of instructional days in a school year, the Chief Superintendent drew to the attention of trustees For Information Item No. 3 which provides information regarding the number of instructional days. The administration will continue to ensure students are receiving the required amount of instructional days. The Chief Superintendent also informed trustees that administration contacted the Province of Manitoba to enquire about the required instructional days and clarification on regulations.

# 54 – Farmer's Market – Clifton School

Trustee Ramos informed trustees that he was able to attend the Farmer's Market at Clifton School by a Grade 3 student. The student's father and grandfather grew the vegetables that were sold at the Farmer's Market in order to help with Clifton School's fundraising. Trustee Ramos congratulated the student, along with the school for the great job and encouraged trustees to attend this event next year.
