SAFETY PLAN

FOR YOUR PROTECTION

- 1. Write down important phone numbers and keep them where they can be easily found and taken with you.
- 2. Prepare neighbors in case you have to send your children to them.
- 3. Ask a neighbor to call the police when she hears violence erupt.
- 4. Get the phone number of the shelter in your area, and keep it in your wallet.
- 5. Keep enough money for taxi fare, so you can leave quickly.

FOR YOUR CHILDREN

- 1. Explain the situation to them.
- 2. Tell them what to do when violence erupts:
 - a. to go to a neighbor.
 - b. to call the police.

Learn the signs of approaching violence GET OUT BEFORE IT STARTS

PREPARE YOURSELF

- 1. Review the following checklist.
- 2. Collect the items on the checklist that you possess.
- 3. Rent your own safety deposit box in a bank far from your house OR find another secure place for your papers. (Especially not in your home).

IF/WHEN YOU LEAVE (WHEN IT IS NOT AN EMERGENCY)

Put in a safe place:

- o Birth certificates: yours and your children's.
- o Marriage contract.
- o Passports or immigration papers.
- o Insurance policies, yours and your children's.
- o Jewelry; receipts of items bought by you or received by contract or will.
- School report cards.
- o Diplomas.
- Any possession of great sentimental value to you.

Keep in your purse:

- o Credit cards and cash on hand.
- o Driver's license.
- o Health and immunization books.
- Social insurance cards.
- o Medicare cards, hospital cards.
- o Bank books.
- Membership cards in your names.
- o Keys to the house.
- o Keys to the safety deposit boxes, yours and your children

Pack (ahead of time and keep in secure place):

- o Clothing for you and the children that can be easily carried.
- o Medications and prescriptions.
- o A favorite toy for each child.

LEAVING

- 1. Go to the nearest shelter or hotel.
- 2. Meet with a lawyer, legal aid or private. Bring all your papers with you (originals, not photocopies.) If you must leave the originals, as the lawyer for photocopies.
- 3. Bring your termination papers and social insurance card with you.
- 4. Obtain welfare if needed.
- 5. Bring photocopies of birth certificates, social insurance cards, your own or joint bank account books.
- 6. Inform the school office of your children's absence and get their report cards.
- 7. Tell the school **NOT** to give out your old or new address.
- 8. DO NOT tell anyone where you are.
