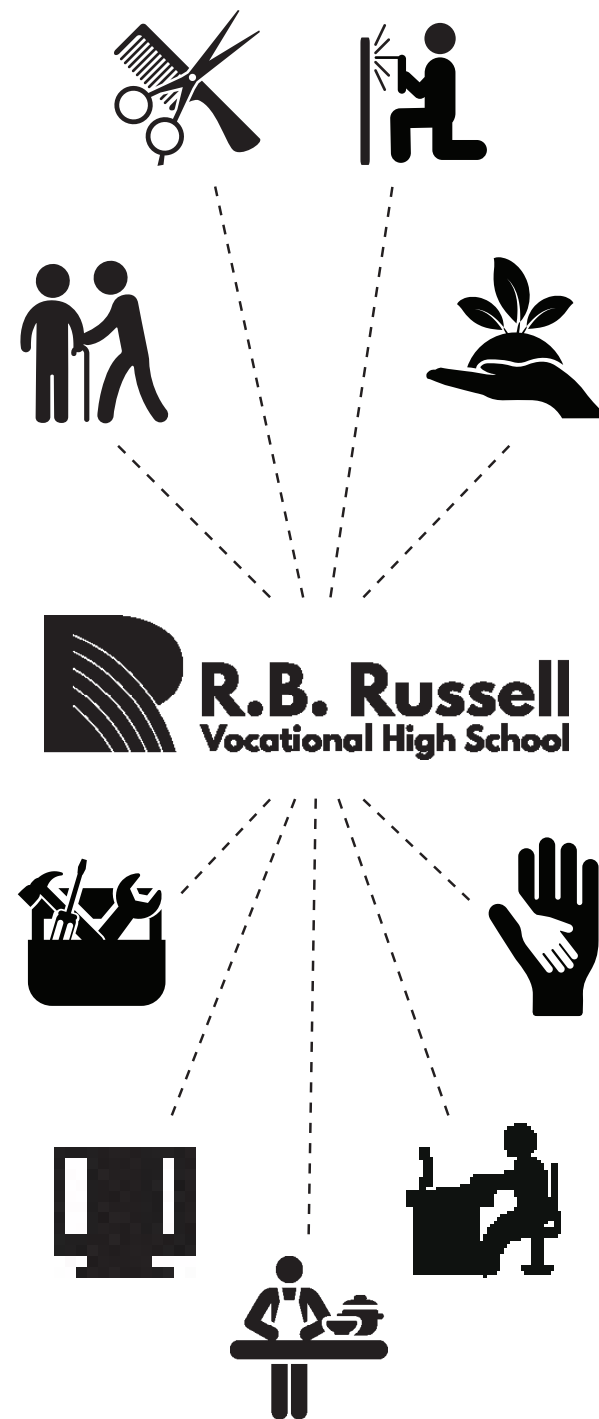

Carpentry*

Students will be instructed in the carpentry and construction trades. All students receive training in the safe use of hand and power tools, drywall application, cabinet making, furniture making and house construction.

Child Care Assistant

The Child Care Assistant Program is designed for students who have an interest in the field of child care and would like to work with children from 12 weeks to 12 years of age. The program content varies depending on the grade level the student is enrolled in. Overall, the academic course work and hands-on activities focus on working with children in Infant, Pre-school, and School-age programs. Students are being prepared to work in the child care field as professional CCA's. Students must submit a criminal record check, and adult and child abuse registry checks.

Culinary Arts*

This program exposes students to a wide variety of occupations in the commercial cooking and baking industries. Students take an active role in food preparation, meat cutting, in-house catering, short-order cooking, cafeteria serving, plus operating the cash register.

Graphic Design

The Graphic Design Program is designed for students who have an eye for design, enjoy working with computers and other new media technologies, and would like to explore a career in Graphic Design or related fields such as animation, web design, or photography. Students are exposed to many aspects of visual communication such as print and digital design/layout, digital image editing and manipulation, illustration, typography, and motion graphics.

Hairstyling*

The Hairstyling Program is designed for students who enjoy meeting and talking with people and working creatively with their hands. A successful career in Hairstyling requires a creative flair, an artistic imagination, good finger dexterity, a pleasing personality, strong customer service skills, and the ability to stand for extended periods of time. The Hairstyling Program is a 1400 hour accredited program which meets apprenticeship training standard. Students must attain a 70% average in both the theory and practical component in all twelve courses in order to enter the apprenticeship.

Health Care Aide

The objective of this program is to provide students with the practical skills necessary to work as part of the health-care team in the role of health care aide. Graduates are recognized by the WRHA and can be employed in hospitals, long term care facilities and in home care. Students will cover basic nursing skills, as well as general anatomy and physiology in order to assist their clients in the activities of daily living. Students must be 18 years of age, submit a criminal record check, and adult and child abuse registry checks.

Horticulture*

This course prepares students for employment in the horticultural and landscaping fields. Students will study all aspects of greenhouse maintenance and production, as well as, outdoor landscaping, design, and maintenance. Plant identification, soil management, plant propagation, seeding and grafting, fertilization and integrated pest management, pruning, power equipment use and maintenance, introduction to floristry, aboriginal plant use, and environmental issues will also be studied.

Welding Technology*

The program's objective is to provide the student with a wide variety of skills suitable for entry level positions in the Welding and Metal Fabrication industries. Trade-related math and blueprint reading is an integral part of the program. Students will work to develop a working knowledge of the principles and techniques in Oxy-Fuel, Stick, MIG and TIG welding. Students will also be introduced to CNC plasma cutting software and to cutting on the CNC Plasma Cam. Personal growth, problem solving, confidence building and safe work attitudes in an industrial work setting form the foundation of the program. Graduating students may challenge for Canadian Welding Bureau Certification.
