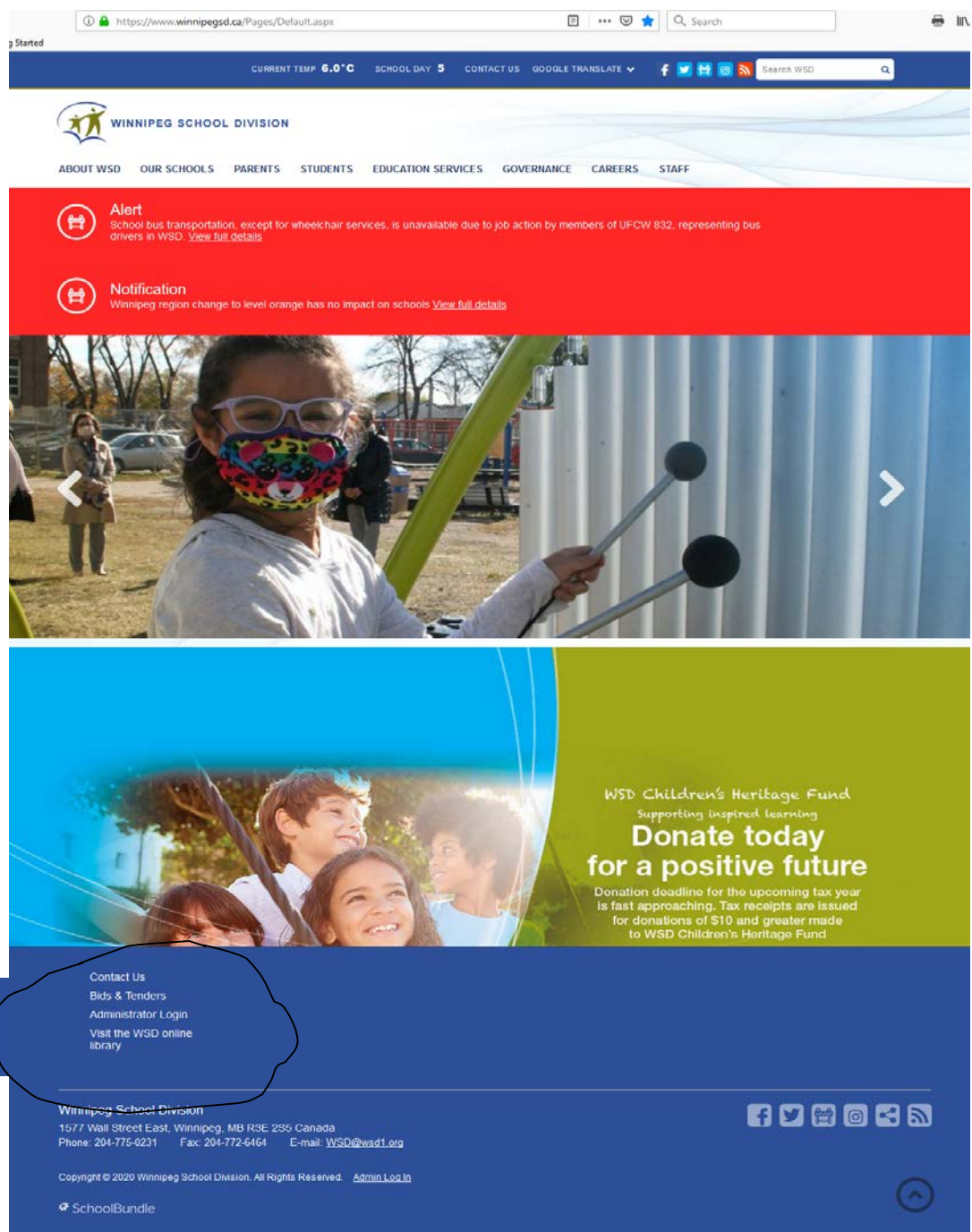
Google Chrome is the browser that is now recommended for My Library Online (called the book river) and Winnipeg School Division library resources.



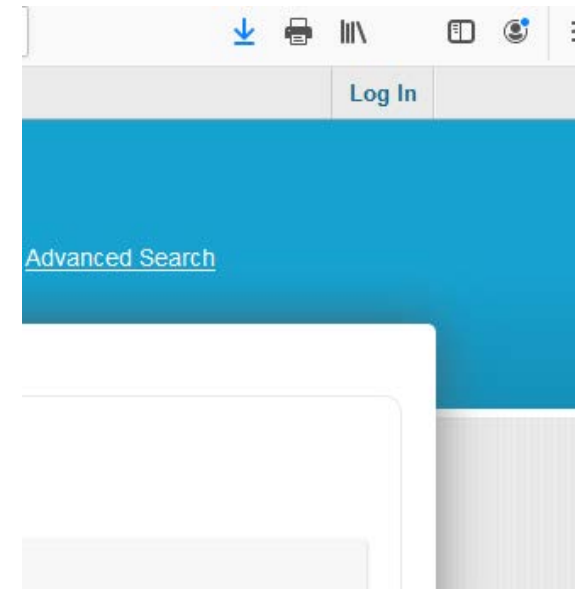

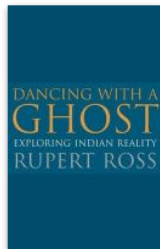

It is this unshakeable bond between them that both saves their lives and thwarts their futures."

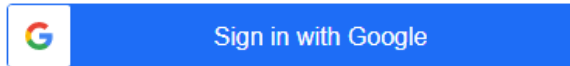

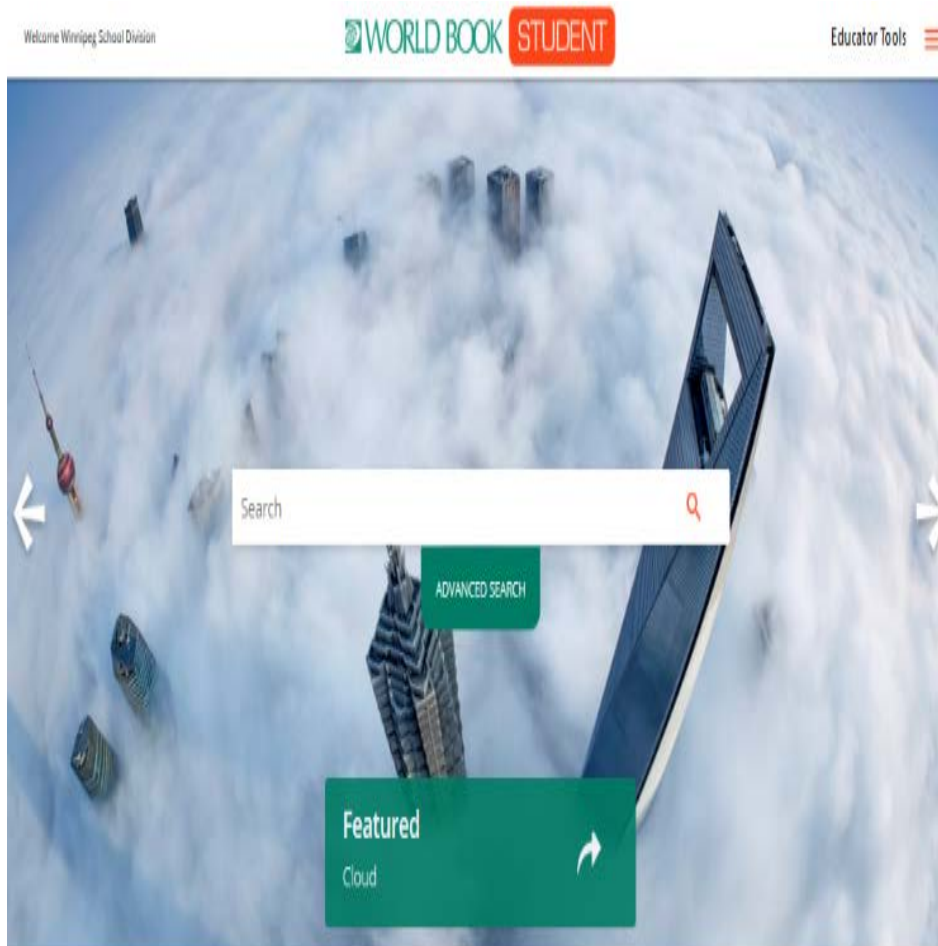



World Book Enciclopedia Estudiantil Hallazgos is the Spanish version of the popular World Book Student. An encyclopedia with articles, multimedia, verified web links, and more – all in Spanish!

National Film Board Campus

NFB Campus is the National Film Board's online media hub. Find resources from a Canadian point of view, by Canadian filmmakers. Students can access more than 5,000 films. While using any school computer, go to NFB.ca. From home, students can access playlists created and shared by a teacher. Recommended for High School students.

Ebscohost

Explore! Discover information on a wide range of subjects from many current magazines and journals. Do simple searches, or use easy-to-browse graphics, that bring together information on popular topics. A text-to-speech tool will read out articles, to assist with student comprehension.

Ebscohost Research for Students: Streamlined searching for high school students. Search a wide variety of subjects from many current magazines, journals, and primary source documents. Results can be saved, copied, emailed and cited.

Other specialty Ebsco databases for high school students include: **Science Reference Center, History Reference Center and Consumer Health Complete.**

Canadian Points of View Reference Centre

Canadian Points of View Reference Centre will assist high school students in researching and understanding the full scope of controversial subjects. Students will discover useful information, perfect for debating, or for crafting arguments and writing position papers, all from a Canadian point of view. Part of Ebscohost.

Repère

Indexes over 300 French-language newspapers and magazines, including 41 full-text magazines from Quebec.

Available from home or school. Please ask your school library staff for username and password.

Winnipeg Free Press

Online versions of the current Winnipeg Free Press are available at schools for students to search, through the Newspapers in Education program. Each school has its own school-based access and school account name/password. Please contact your school library staff for access.



Winnipeg Free Press Archives

Search the pages of Winnipeg's oldest surviving newspaper, The Winnipeg Free Press, including content all the way back to 1872. Students can search by date, keyword, and name, and limit by year if needed. This is a great resource for finding a Winnipeg perspective on many big events, like the sinking of the Titanic, battles in World War I and II, and on important people in our history. Students can also search for information closer to them: family histories, histories of their home and school, and more. The WFP Archives has IP based authentication, so no password is needed from school. Create your own personal account to save information.

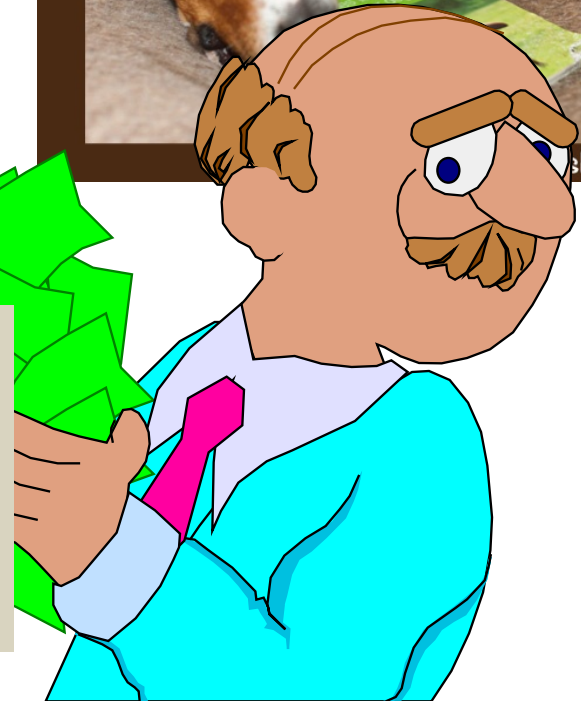
