FUNdementals of Science


C.S.I

Today, February 22, 2 students from the University of Manitoba did a presentation of what CSI is. CSI stands for crime scene investigation. The first thing they showed us was chromatology. Chromatology is when you find the brand of color and use that to find the suspect. You can do this in your home you will need paper, a cup a black marker and some alcohol. Take the marker and the paper, draw a line and put the paper into the alcohol. The lighter colors will go to the top while the darker colors will stay to the bottom.

After the lesson on chromatology. We did a lesson on fingerprint analysis. The 2 students gave all of us a black marker and a piece of paper and told us to color on our fingers then push down on the paper gently. It made a fingerprint which we could analyze. They pointed out that all of our fingerprints were different.

The second last thing we did was analyzing handwriting where we had to analyze 2 different notes that we had a sample of all the suspect's writing. This was kind of boring.


