

Students in grades 4-8 will complete the school year with a unit on track and field. We will develop an understanding of the rules and




mechanics of the different events. We will develop skills in short and long distance running as well as jumping and throwing. All students will experience success and enjoyment through participation in the activities.




### FOR THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR


