Tomatosphere Science Investigation



Room 15 recently participated in the **Tomatosphere Science Investigation**. This began from the question: How does the space environment affect the growth of tomato seeds?

We were provided with two packs of seeds, labelled V and W. One pack spent 4 months on the International Space Station. We were not told which one had been to space. We started our investigation by writing a hypothesis. Many of us thought that the seeds that were on the space station would grow differently. Some of us thought they would grow quicker and some thought they wouldn't grow at all!

After we planted and labelled our seeds, we waited for them to germinate. We learned that germination is when the plant grows its first two leaves. We recorded the data on a chart each day to count how many seeds had germinated. More seeds from seed pack 'V' germinated.

After we submitted our results, we were told that seed pack 'W' had been sent to space! We are continuing to observe our space tomatoes and plan to plant a few in the garden beds outside.

Outdoor Learning

Grade 3 and **4 students** in **Room 12** were busy digging out weeds from our community garden beds in preparation to plant some plants native to our prairie province. We hope to have these garden beds ready by this month and used throughout the summer months for the community.

Wednesday, September 6, 2023 - First Day of School Safe school attendance is a priority for student learning.

All students should complete daily COVID-19 Screening Tool **prior to** attending school.

I have symptoms of COVID-19

Take a rapid antigen test or PCR test

Test result is negative

It is recommended that you complete a second test 24 hours after the first negative result and if it continues to be negative, it is recommend you do a third test after another 24 hours. If still negative, you may return to school if you have no fever and your symptoms have improved over the last 24 hours.

It is recommended that you stay home from school for 5 days and you have no fever and your symptoms are improving over the past 24 hours. You must wear a medical mask to school for an

additional 5 days.
