### **About Earl Grey School**

Earl Grey School is now 110 years old!!! We are a Nursery – Grade 8 school that offers 2-year and 3-year Multiage Program and a Spanish Bilingual Program. We also offer French to our Grades 4 – 8 students.

Students are engaged in student-centered learning and work with mentors to explore their passions and big questions. We value land-based learning and try to get outside as much as possible to explore in our outdoor classroom, gardens, and community. We work hard to create global citizens who care for their environment and what is happening in the world and endeavor to make a big positive difference in this world! Our Phys. Ed, Arts programs, and extracurricular activities are integral to educating the whole child and developing our School Spirit and Community. Students take part in "Arts Explosion" (younger students) or "Creativity Hour" (older students) where they have opportunities to explore and develop in many engaging areas, such as drama, coding, guitar, and visual arts.

We are a school that thinks deeply and engages in critical conversations to create an inclusive, authentic, experiential, relevant, and joyful learning environment. We revisit our beliefs regularly in order to challenge our thinking and move forward in a good way. We work closely with our families to make sure that they feel welcome, valued, and an integral part of our school community.

- We partnered with NEEDS Center to provide additional supports to our EAL learners
- Students participated in a variety of teams such as our intramural program, Volleyball Team, Basketball Team, Badminton Team, Soccer Team, and Running Club. Our Jr. High Soccer Team won the finals! The Basketball Team was the winner of the Hugh John McDonald basketball Tournament, and The Grade 7 Girls were finalists in Badminton
- Students participated in a variety of whole-school Phys. Ed events such as the Terry Fox Run, Gym Riot, Winter Carnival, Mini Olympics and Field Day
- Students participated in Forest Time at Woodhaven 3 times this year.
- Student nurses did practicums within our school and students learned about relevant health topics with them
- School-wide common area training was provided to all students after each school break
- We attended WSD's 3rd STEAM Fair at Alloway Hall
- We had TWO whole-school concerts this year
- We used our collaborative design skills to create a whole-school Winter Village
- We participated in an Honour Walk to bring awareness to MMIWG+ in our community and together with Kelvin High School – the Moosehide Walk
- Our Gr. 4 students participated in the Swimming Counts program
- Spirit Week was planned by our Junior High Fun Team and enjoyed by all
- Annual Earl Grey Talent Show was a huge success!
- Students wrote notes of kindness and delivered them to community mailboxes.
- We participated in 2 weeks of land-based learning using the Walking Together book to inspire us
- Earl Grey K (Kilometre) walks through the community happened throughout the year. Many walks include interacting with community by dancing and waving through windows, and hanging notes and decorations on trees
- We marked Black History Month by learning about Black leaders and reading a wide variety of books by Black authors
- We visited the Human Rights Museum, Morning Sound Farm, Assiniboine Park, The Leaf, Oak Hammock Marsh, Pan Am Pool, Transcona Aquatic Park, Public Libraries, The Manitoba Museum, The Humane Society, The Electrical Museum, Winnipeg Animal Services.

- Grade 1 6 students participated in Arts Explosion where they explored visual arts, music, dance, drama and coding
