Elmwood is a public high school in Winnipeg, Manitoba enrolling 853 students from grades 7-12. We are proud to be an integral part of the Elmwood community.

Elmwood offers a wide range of opportunities for students, including high quality academic programming for all grades, Fine and Dramatic Arts exhibitions, firstclass Technology Education, business development with the Elmwood Supply Company, leadership and community volunteer programs through CATT, an Indigenous Grad Coach and Lodge Room, intensive educational supports, and many other ways for students to make the most of their school experience. The Breakfast and Nutrition Program made important strides with the hiring of a food coordinator, Chef Rob, and now our school-run cafeteria provides free food to all students throughout the day because full stomachs mean open minds. Over the last 10 months, we celebrated with Pep Rallies, Spirit Weeks, Community Forums, Sports Tournaments, Open House, a Celebration of the Arts, the musical production 'Matilda', Band Concerts, Awards Ceremonies, Feeder School visits, Coffee House performances, and the first ever Elmwood PAC Community BBQ.

This year, Elmwood sends 90 Graduates off to spread the lessons of compassion, grit, and kindness that they have learned, to enrich the wider world.
