SCHOOL TRAFFIC & STUDENT SAFETY

Drop-Off and Pick-Up Guidelines

Please adhere to all traffic rules within school zones. Student safety is our highest priority and we ask that **all drop-offs and pick-ups be done at the side of the school on Burnell Street, adjacent to the field.** There has been an increase in traffic violations and we ask that we all do our part to ensure the safety of all community members. See below for safety procedures:

Double Parking is Not Permitted

• This has been identified as the most dangerous practice around the school. It limits visibility, traffic flow, and boxes-in drivers and school buses. Double parking is illegal at all times and subject to enforcement action.

Parking in Staff Parking Lot

• The staff parking lot is for staff only, and not to be used as a pick-up or drop-off zone for students.



COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Dale Springer, our new Community Support Worker (CSW), will be at General Wolfe School every afternoon. The responsibilities of a CSW may include but are not limited to:

- support/advocacy to students and families
- home visits to strengthen school and community connection

- volunteer recruitment
- organizing community event (e.g., feasts, BBQ)
- networking with other agencies to provide additional supports and referrals to families

- office confiscation and parent/guardian picks up the phone






Cell phones/devices can be used on school grounds:
