PBIS helps students by defining very clearly the expected behaviours in each part of the school, by working with students to understand positive behaviours, following the group plan, by rewarding positive behaviour and by gathering data on challenging areas in order to work on targeted solutions.

Safe Arrival

We operate a call-back system to ensure the safety of our students. Please call the school **SAFE ARRIVAL 1-855-278-4513** or visit https://go.schoolmessenger.ca before the bell time of the current day if your child will be absent or late for class. Please note that it is important that students arrive as close to the bell as possible to coincide with our outdoor supervision.

Extracurricular Activities

We host a variety of extracurricular activities that keep students connected to the school above and beyond the classroom experience. During the school year, there are many opportunities for students to become involved in the activities of our school, including extracurricular activities. As an Early Years school, our extracurricular activities are geared to keeping our young students as active and engaged as possible. École George V School is proud to offer a full complement of extracurricular activities such as: art club, leadership club, running club, volleyball, basketball, cross country running, badminton, band club, and Green Team. We encourage all students to participate with us in activities outside the classroom where new experiences can be found, new friendships made and new talents discovered.

Phone Calls

During the school we encourage students to only call home in case of an emergency. Only in the event of an emergency do we deliver messages to students. Minimizing interruptions helps to optimize learning times.

Email

Many people find it very convenient to communicate by email. Please note that while teachers are teaching, they may not be checking email until later in the day when they have a prep. The teachers' first responsibility is to work with students and depending on their day, they may not get to the messages before dismissal.

Attendance

We know that parents have an important role in setting their child(ren) up for success. When student(s) are on time and in attendance regularly, with the exception of illness, they are given the best opportunities to learn. Absences have a significant effect on academic performance.

Parking Lot Safety

The parking lot is for staff use. In the name of safety for our children, please refrain from using the parking lot for drop off and pick up your child. Only families with an Accessible Parking pass may use the parking lot to pick up and drop off their child.

Access to the Building

In accordance with Provincial regulations and for the safety of our population, our rear Linkway doors are opened during entrance & recess times. During any other time of the school day, entry to the school may only be gained by using the parking lot doors and buzzing the office to gain entry to the school. Visitors are asked to report to the office to sign in. A staff member will assist you in calling your child to the office if needed. Our Main Office is located on the 2nd floor.

If you wish to speak with a teacher, please email them and make an appointment with them in advance.

Shoes

For reasons of safety, students must have shoes on at all times. Each student needs a pair of indoor runners for Phys Ed classes.

Lunch Program

We offer a user pay lunch program operated jointly by the Parent Advisory Council (PAC) and the Lunch Program Coordinator. Registration and information are available in the office or by email georgevlunchprogram@outlook.com.

Students must bring their own lunch with them to the lunch program. If registered in the lunch program, students are not allowed to leave the school grounds during lunch hour.

Volunteering

We welcome volunteers! When you arrive at the school, we ask that you sign in at the front office and wear a 'volunteer/guest sticker or pin' identifying you to all in our building. Your support with this practice is appreciated as it is helpful in creating a safe and secure environment for our students.

Student Support Services

École George V School provides a variety of services to support student learning: Resource, Counseling, and a literacy support team. Access to divisional services include: Reading Clinician, Speech & Language Clinician, Psychology, Social Work, Occupational Therapy, and Physical Therapy. The process of accessing these services is a team decision beginning with the classroom teacher and support personnel.

Reporting Practices

Winnipeg School Division reports to parents using the provincial Report Card in the school year. This will consist of 3 written report cards and 2 Tri-conferences throughout the school year.

Nutrition Policy

All schools in Manitoba have Nutrition Policies. At École George V School, staff and parents follow the nutrition policy set out by the Winnipeg School Division. At all student celebrations healthy snacks are highly encouraged. Teachers teach Health and Nutrition in their classrooms.

Allergy Alert

George V School has a well-developed plan around allergies. We have many children with severe food allergies, thus our school is declared 'Allergy Aware'. Students and staff are asked not to bring peanut or tree-nut products into the school. If there are additional allergies in your child's classroom, you will be notified by letter the first week of school, with all the necessary details.

Medication

Students who require medication to be used in emergency situations (EpiPens, inhalers, etc.) are required to have that medication on their person during the school day. URIS forms will be filled out, signed and placed in the students' file. In the event that your child requires short term medications such as antibiotics please contact the office to fill out the necessary paperwork. NO MEDICATION can be administered without these procedures in place.

School Photos

School Pictures are taken each year in the fall, and orders filled in time for winter break. To complement the individual photos, student photos may be offered each spring.

Valuables

Money and other valuables such as electronics should not be brought to school. The school does not assume responsibility for items which may be lost/stolen and we strongly discourage students

from bringing valuables. Monies requested by the school should be immediately handed to homeroom teachers.

Emergency Preparedness

Together École George V School in conjunction with Winnipeg School Division, work to ensure that in the unfortunate event of an emergency we are well prepared. Students and staff regularly practice fire drills, hold and secure, and lock down procedures. Our evacuation plan would involve moving our population to Elmwood High School and contacting parents through School Messenger and emergency contacts to pick up the children.

Preparation for Winter

With the arrival of the cold weather, we ask that parents ensure that children are properly dressed to be outside for both our 20-minute daytime recesses and the 30-minute lunch recess. Unless temperatures with windchills are -27 degrees C or below, students are expected to remain outside until the entry bell rings.

Students go outside at recess and at noon between 12:00 and 12:55 p.m. Please time your child's morning and noon arrival at school as close as possible to the entrance bell to avoid extended time outside in cold or wet weather.

Students will remain inside for INDOOR RECESS when weather is determined to be too inclement,

-27 degrees C or colder as per division guidelines.

When a heavy snowfall occurs, or when "blizzard" status is granted, please listen to the radio to determine if Winnipeg School' schools will be open. Occasionally, the radio stations may announce that buses will not run, but schools will be open.

Bicycle Safety

Please be aware that the school/school division does not assume any responsibility for bicycles, scooters, or other personal transportation items that are stolen or damaged.

Please note the following safety rules below:

- Riding bicycles to school is encouraged.
- Please wear helmets for your safety as per Provincial guidelines.
- Walk your bicycles/ active transportation devices when you are on the school grounds.
- Lock your bike/ active transportation device with a sturdy lock.

- Record the serial number of your bicycle.
- Only one person on a bike at a time.
- Stay alert for cars coming out of driveways, lanes or parking spaces.
- Drive defensively.
- Please follow all traffic signs and rules for safety while commuting to school and on the way home.
