### INDIGENOUS ACADEMIC SUCCESS MS. GARAND

Teachers at Glenelm will be building capacity in their knowledge of Indigenous Education this month by participating in a learning day on the province of Manitoba's new education framework Mamàhtawisiwin: The Wonder We Are Born With. The goal of this learning is to help our students better understand the Land Acknowledgement we share every morning and our relationships to each other. The Indigenous Academic Success committee has been hard at work organizing a whole school land-based learning day and is very excited to share it with the whole school community. ## **STEAN** - science, technology, engineering, art, math MS. WHELAN



•Nursery/Kindergarten students, with Ms. Angel, have been working on "What Makes Something Super?" They have looked at super trees, read a super book called "Everything You Need for a Treehouse," and then designed and built super treehouses.Next, they will be looking into superpowers and superheroes.

•Grade 1/2 students, with Ms. Jacqueline, had a great time at the Zoo. They learned a lot about Polar Bears and other animals found in Canada's North. They had the opportunity to each choose an arctic animal, and create their own zoo habitat for that animal.

•Grade 3 students, with Ms. Barkman, are going to be learning about Fairy Tales, and designing, engineering and creating, a solution to a Fairy Tale problem. We look forward to seeing what they come up with, and cannot wait to share.

•Grade 4/5 students, with Mrs. Garand, also had the opportunity to visit the Zoo with the grade 1/2 students. This was a great extension to their unit about Canada's North. They read a book called, "An Inuksuk Means Welcome," by Mary Wallace, and thoughtfully designed and built their own Inuksuk's that had their own meaning. The class was further inspired by a book called "Animals that Might Exist by Professor O'Logist," by Stephane Nicolet, and created their own arctic animal. They are currently working on describing their animals, their adaptations, and other details about their animal and the part of the arctic they live in.

•Grade 5/6 students, with Mrs. Ferguson, have been busy learning about early explorers to Canada. They have broken off into groups to do some exploring of their own.We can't wait to see what they discover.They are also about to get into learning about integers and applying their skills to a Winnipeg-opoly game.
