- Room 3 created superhero shields to protect their superheroes from flying objects. Coming up, creating our superhero headquarters out of gingerbread...fun and yummy.
- Room 7 did some research on different arctic animals with the Grade 4/5 class. Participated in identifying, sorting, and classifying animals, and finally, worked on their group collaboration skills. Up next, an investigation into the town of Churchill, Manitoba, as well as a deeper look into Inuit culture.
- Room 6 worked in groups to design and create an item that solved a problem in a Fairy Tale that they read. Then, after reading Hansel and Gretel as a class, they broke off into groups of Witches, and Hansel and Gretel's. The Witch groups designed and built houses that were strong, stable, and attractive, in an attempt to bring in more of the village's children. The Hansel and Gretel groups, then had to design and build catapults that would destroy the Witches houses, to save the villages children. Up next....testing our projects and reevaluating our process to think about what could have been done differently to improve our designs.
- Room 1 participated in some research with the Grade 1/2 classroom. Showing their skills as technology leaders and role models. They later completed their "Create an Arctic Animal" project by making trading cards specific to their animal.
- Room 8 has been super busy learning about matter, solubility of substances, the environment, leading our school recycling program, doing homemade STEAM bags, and so much more.
