# >>> GLENLEA GREENHOUSE FUNDRAISER

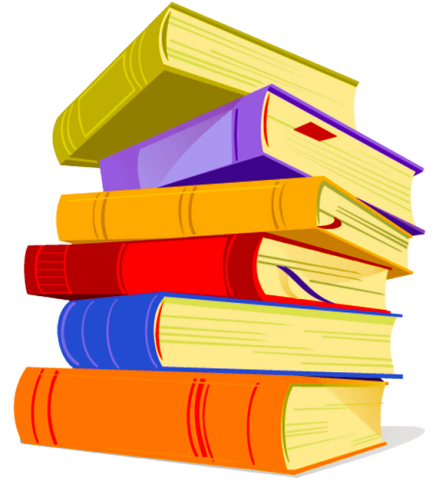

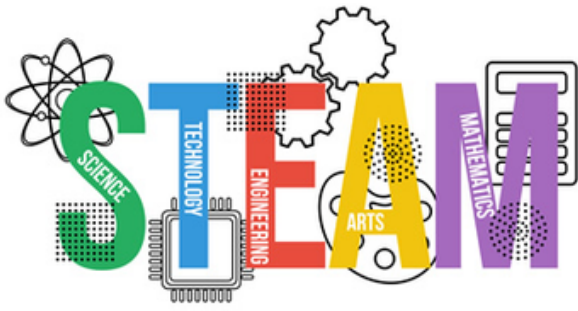




# I LOVE TO READ MONTH!

The students and staff at Glenelm School reached their reading goals for I Love To Read month! Students celebrated with pizza and a dance party, and had the opportunity to duct tape Mr. Mangaron to the wall in the gym!





I am excited to share the latest STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) activities your children have been engaging in! These hands-on projects allow students to explore their creativity, think critically, and develop new skills in a fun, interactive way. Here's a glimpse of what each grade has been working on:

### **Room 7 (Grade 1/2s): Our community**

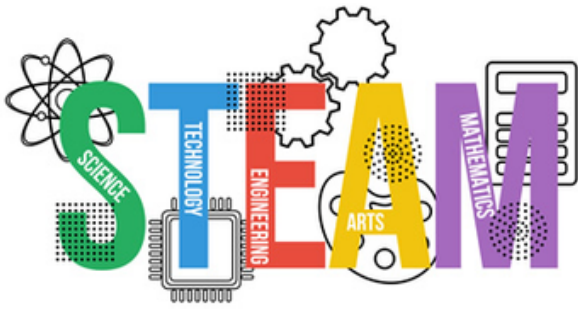
In Grade 1/2, students are diving into the concept of Community through a unique and hands-on project—creating a 3D map of their local community! They are learning about the places that make up the world around them, from local schools and parks to businesses and homes. Using various materials like paper, cardboard, and paint, students are bringing their understanding of the community to life by building models that represent different structures and landmarks.



### **Room 5 (Grade 2/3): Exploring Canada**

In Grade 2 and 3, students are exploring the vast and diverse country of Canada! From the Arctic to the prairies, students are learning about Canada's regions, cultures, and histories through creative, hands-on activities. Students have created their own maps of Canada using plasticine. To introduce the different provinces in Canada, there was an activity where students had to play "Guess the province". There were pictures of different landmarks, national animals, plants and fun riddles for each province and students had to guess what province it was by looking at the pictures and trying to figure out the different clues.





### Room 6 (Grade 3/4): Exploring Light

Grade 3/4 students are illuminating their scientific minds with a hands-on study of light! We went on a scavenger hunt in the school looking for different sources of light. We discussed and talked about which sources were human made and which sources are natural. One of the STEAM challenges they completed is called the pinhole box challenge. Students had to figure out what was inside of a box that had one hole in it, without opening it. The materials they had to use were a flashlight and a pencil. The students were able to figure out what was inside of the boxes!

### Room 1 (Grade 4/5): The Human Digestive, Circulatory and Skeletal System

Room 1 has been learning about the human digestive, circulatory and skeletal systems. The Grade 4/5 students did a science experiment demonstrating how the human digestive system works. The materials used was bread, water, vinegar and paper towels. They broke up the bread into smaller pieces. The water and vinegar represented saliva and stomach acid. The paper towels represented the intestines. They had so much fun with this science experiment!



We're so proud of the work our students have been doing and look forward to seeing more exciting learning experiences unfold throughout the rest of the year. Thank you for supporting your child's education and for encouraging their curiosity and exploration.
