


WE ARE GOING DIGITAL!!

GLENELM SCHOOL'S MISSION STATEMENT

At Glenelm School we provide a safe, respectful, friendly and caring environment for learning.

We foster productive and responsible citizenship by practicing personal responsibility, understanding, acceptance of others, cooperation and teamwork.

We believe that a quality education is a life-long process involving physical, mental, emotional and social development.

We believe that we need to develop creative thinking, a love for learning, self-esteem and respect for others.



School Hours

The outside bell rings at 8:55 and 12:55 for student entry. Morning classes begin at 9:00 AM, afternoon classes at 1:00 PM. Students are dismissed as follows:

Kindergarten/Nursery at 11:30 AM

Grades 1 to 6 at 12:00 noon

All afternoon students at 3:30 PM

Office Hours Regular school days: 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM

Answering Machine

Outside of regular office hours an answering machine is available for messages. Occasionally during the day the secretary may have to leave the office briefly. The answering machine will also be turned on at these times.

Call Back System

Please call or send a note to let us know if your child will be absent. We will call you if your child is absent and we haven't heard from you but it saves time if you notify us. "Call Backs" begin at 9:15 AM and 1:15 PM. Students who arrive late are asked to check in at the office to pick up a late slip.

Students Leaving School Early

Whenever students need to leave school early, such as for a medical appointment, we ask that the student be picked up by the parent (or another responsible adult). In an emergency, we can send students home accompanied by two school patrols. We would like to minimize this practice since it interrupts the school day for the patrols.

Change of Address and/or Telephone Numbers:

Please notify the office immediately when changes occur.

Supervision of Students

We have teachers and educational assistants on duty in the playground at the following times:

- 8:45 AM to 8:55 AM
- during recesses
- 12:45 PM to 12:55 PM

School Safety Patrols are on duty at the following times:

- 8:40 AM to 8:55 AM
- 12:00 noon to 12:10 PM
- 12:40 PM to 12:55 PM
- 3:30 PM to 3:40 PM

Please help to ensure that your children travel to and from school only during times when patrols are on duty. Also, students must use the sidewalks and cross at the corners where patrols are on duty unless accompanied by their parent. Students should not use the back lanes.

Transportation for Nursery and Kindergarten Students

In the interest of safety, <u>only a parent or designated responsible adult</u> is always to accompany Nursery and Kindergarten students to and from school each day.

Reporting

Report cards go home in November, March and June. In addition, parent-teacher conferences are scheduled in November and student-led conferences in March. If you would like information on your child's progress at other times during the year, please contact the classroom teacher.

Recess

All children in grades 1 to 6 are expected to go outside for a 15 minute recess both morning and afternoon. Students who are well enough to come to school are usually well enough to have an outdoor recess break.

Recess periods are as follows:

morning recesses: 10:35 to 10:50 afternoon recesses: 2:15 to 2:30

Recess is indoors if it's raining or if the windchill is –28 or colder. When the windchill is between -25 to -27, we may have a shorter recess <u>or</u> allow students to come inside to warm up. There are times when the windchill recorded at The Forks is reported to be high but local conditions are milder because of the shelter provided by buildings and trees. Please help to see that the students are dressed appropriately for the weather.

Cell Phones, Cameras and Personal Electronics

Cell phones, cameras and personal electronics are not allowed at school. However, if a parent/guardian finds it necessary for their child to bring a cell phone to school for <u>safety reasons</u>, not social reasons, then the parent/guardian needs to contact Mr. Mangaron to discuss the matter.

Playground

Playground equipment is provided by the school. We request that students do not bring equipment from home. Students can bring a ball for recess use as long as they are willing to share. If a ball goes over the playground fence, the student must check with the teacher or educational assistant before going to retrieve it.

Behaviour of Students

Glenelm students are expected to behave in a safe and respectful manner and to do their best to learn. If necessary, we will request your help on behaviour issues.

In the event of damage to property, the person responsible will be asked to make restitution.

The Winnipeg School Division has adopted a Code of Behaviour which is endorsed by Glenelm School staff and the Glenelm School Parent Advisory Council.

Snack Food

The school has a "no junk food" policy including gum, seeds, soft drinks and candy. There may be times during the year when a class has a small party and an exception is made to this policy. We ask for your support in sending only nutritious snacks with the students. We also need everyone's help to keep the playground litter-free by using the garbage bins provided on the playground.

Show and Tell

Many of the primary classes have a designated day for students to bring a toy to school or other personal article (no pets please). The students know in advance when it is their turn for Show and Tell. Except for Show and Tell, we ask that students not bring toys or other personal articles to school.

Glenelm School Parent Advisory Council

All parents who send their children to Glenelm are welcome to participate in the Parent Advisory Council. A meeting is held once a month and you can attend regularly or as often as your schedule allows. The dates are listed in your child's agenda, as well as the monthly calendar.

The Parent Advisory Council supports the education of students at Glenelm. We often have informal discussions about various issues facing the school. Some of the significant accomplishments of the Parent Council include raising money to support the purchase of SMART Boards, enhancing the music program, the library and play structure.

If you are interested in joining the Parent Advisory Council please contact the office and your contact information will be passed on to the current board members.

In-services

All schools are allowed ten days when the whole school is closed for in-services or administration purposes. Please refer to your child's agenda and the monthly calendar for those dates.

Nurse

The nurse assigned to the school **is Karla Gardner (204-223-1737).** Karla serves the Glenelm Neighbourhood and Glenelm School on an on-call basis. Children who are between 4 and 6 years old need a booster immunization for diphtheria, pertussis and tetanus as well as a second dose of measles, mumps, and rubella vaccine. These immunizations will be offered within the school year for those children have not had them done by their doctor. The grade 6 students will be offered the HPV Immunization and the Hepatitis B vaccine.

Some of the services provided by the nurse are: health education, routine vision and hearing screening, health appraisals, and immunizations.

Student Medication

Parents who wish the school to administer medication must first have their doctor complete forms to support the request. These forms are available from the school office. All medication must be properly labelled and given to the office for safekeeping.

Student Accident Insurance

You will be receiving information regarding student accident insurance. The insurance is a good value and covers some potentially expensive situations for a very reasonable cost. It covers the student 24 hours per day/365 days per year and covers accidents whether at school or outside school hours. Please have a careful look at this information when it arrives at your home.

Halloween Costumes

To help discourage violence and ensure the safest and best educational environment for your children we ask that you avoid sending your child to school in a Halloween costume which portrays the killing or hurting of someone else.

Weapons or items depicting weapons (swords, guns, knives, etc.) which may be part of a costume, should be left at home. Please support our attempt to discourage violence.

Lost and Found

Each year many articles find their way to the lost and found bin. To help reduce losses we suggest that **all students' articles be labelled, especially all gym wear, outdoor clothing and boots.** Lost items can be found in the lost and found box located in the link entrance. Small items such as rings, keys, etc. are kept in the office. In December and June unclaimed Lost and Found articles are donated to charity.

Lunch Program

The Lunch Program is operated by the Glenelm School Parent Advisory Council, and is located in the library. Please notify the school office if your child will not be attending on a given day. Lunch Program also takes attendance.

Child Care

Can You Imagine School Age Care & Education Centre Inc. is a licensed before and after school program that operates in the gymnasium of Glenelm School on school days from 7:00 AM to school start and from 3:30 to 5:30 PM. For more information, call 204-668-4822.

Also, if you are interested in providing child care in your home part-time, full-time, before school, at lunch, after school and/or in-service days please call the school office at 204-667-8534 so this information can be made available for parents who enquire.

NSF Cheques

Due to the expense and staff time needed to process NSF cheques, we have instituted a charge, consistent with Parent Council practice. We will require a payment to cover our costs associated with NSF cheques.

Safe Schools Handbook

Schools are required to have the following practices:

- 10 Fire Drills-once per month
- 1 Evacuation Practice-to be held in September
- 3 Lockdown/Hold and Secure practices

LOCKDOWN

A lockdown is a critical incident response that secures students and staff, usually in classrooms, to prevent access or harm to the occupants of the lockdown locations. This may also involve quickly moving students and staff from unsecured locations to secure locations.

HOLD and SECURE

Hold and Secure is used when it is desirable to secure the school due to an emergency situation occurring outside and not related to the school. In this situation, all exterior doors are locked and monitored, to allow any students from the outside to enter, but the doors should otherwise remain locked. Classes continue to function normally. Types of evens that trigger a Hold and Secure are serious criminal offences in close proximity to a school or where a suspect has been pursued by police near a school.
