VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

To ensure student safety...

- We ask that all caregivers and visitors report to the office using the <u>FRONT DOORS</u> of the school (please do not enter through student doors).
- Please use the BUZZ in entry and report directly to the office.
- If you wish to speak to a teacher, please make arrangements in the office. Teachers are expected to be supervising and engaging with students and are not always immediately available.
- Students arriving late should enter through the front doors to sign in at the office.
 Please do not accompany your child to class. Staff may be called to support if necessary.
- Caregivers accessing the FAMILY ROOM are to sign in at the office and head directly to ROOM 124.

COMMUNICATING WITH TEACHERS

- Many of our teachers use SEESAW or GOOGLE CLASSROOM to connect with caregivers and provide a window into the classroom on a regular basis.
- Some platforms have direct messaging –
 please recognize that our staff are engaged
 with learners and are unable to continuously
 monitor your messages.
- Any URGENT or TIME SENSITIVE communication should be communicated to the office either by phone or in person.
- Teachers or admin will do their best to respond to your communication within 1 school day.
- Teachers and administration are not expected to respond to communication in the evenings or on the weekends.



 School attendance is extremely important in a student's success at school. Absences impact learning as well as healthy relationships with peers.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Missing 10%, or 2 days a month, over the course of the school year, can affect a student's academic success.
- Chronic absences will result with INCOMPLETE (IN) scores on report cards, as teachers are unable to accurately assess learning growth.

WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT

- When a student is absent for 3 or more days without communication from caregivers - the school will reach out with a phone call or a home visit.
- If absences continue a letter from the school will be mailed and placed in PUPIL files. Caregivers will be asked to attend the school for a planning meeting.
- Chronic absenteesim will result in the school contacting outside angencies for support.
