
*Assiniboine Park was officially established in 1909.


*The park covers 1,100 acres.


Class News:

Students have been having fun with reading rhythms! This is called "Eyes and Ears."


Students silently read 2-4 rhythms on a slide, then listen to one rhythm performed by Ms.

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
In Our School: Ocean-Wise Sea Dome

Coming Up: Family Fun BBQ




Come join the fun at Inkster's first Family Fun BBQ!
