Message from Administration

I am pleased to share that our school has been granted \$127,000 through Province's Manitoba's Teachers' Idea Fund. It is a five-year, \$25 million investment in the ideas and innovations of front-line teachers, staff, and school leaders from across our Manitoba. Our grant met the criteria of targeting student and staff wellness while exploring innovative models of teaching. Our approach is always from a holistic one that allows us to support a child's development supporting growth through the mind, body, spirit and emotions. This philosophy supports our staff and students transitioning from one grade to another, while engaging with our families, community and the natural world.

The Teachers' Idea Fund Grant will support our One School Vision - Our "One School Vision" is rooted in relationships – with one's self, each other, our community and the natural world. As a community, we are united in creating a better future for all of our students and we are galvanized in a common cause, to redress the legacy of residential schools and advance the process of Canadian reconciliation.

Together, we want to build a one-school vision that focuses on relationships and unifies the Cree and Ojibwe bilingual programs with the rest of our culturally diverse school, and includes the Junior High Autism Program and Nursery Program students.

We want all classrooms and students to participate in multi-cultural learning experiences, which encompass all of the diversity within our building. The grant monies will allow us to expedite our efforts around reconciliation and laying a strong foundation of community building. This will ensure our school, community, city and province are strong for generations to come. The majority of our students and staff are unaware of the rich cultures found within in our school and that the traditions found in both the Cree and Ojibwe cultures are similar to those of all the cultures found in our school.

Many of our students and their families have excellent attendance and this needs to be celebrated. Some families are struggling with regular attendance or being late to class. Our school data gives us reason to develop strategies that focus on both celebrating attendance successes, improving student absenteeism and late arrivals to school.

Research indicates that missing more than 5 days of school each year, regardless of the cause, affects student academic performance and starts shaping attitudes about school. Therefore, we must realize that excused absences and unexcused absences have similar impact on student academic performance. A school committee called Safety and Belonging, representing teachers from across all grade levels and subjects has been formed this year. One of the committee's goals is to use data to develop strategies and initiatives designed to celebrate, sustain and increase attendance and therefore academic performance over the school year.

The process will be as collaborative as possible and will involve consultation with students, parents, and staff. This will include gathering information by speaking to classrooms, student council, parent council, teachers and educational assistants.

In the near future more information will be distributed for parents and guardians through letters, the school newsletter, our website and weekly emails. At any time, if you have feedback to provide please share it with our child's classroom teacher, our support staff, office staff, or contact Ms. Pelletier or myself.

Join us for a fun, hands-on afternoon of making art using the cyanotype process! Discovered in 1842, one of the oldest photographic printing processes, cyanotypes are made using UV light and a photo-sensitive solution resulting in deep blue images on paper or fabric. We will create designs utilizing small objects with varying degrees of translucency. Bring your own objects or choose from the ones provided as we explore themes of community and neighbourhood. Materials and light snacks provided.

Sarah Grawley is a photo-based artist who works with ideas generated from lived experience, using different

photographic technologies and materials. She has been investigating the impact that memory, place and loss have on identity, using analog photography, pinhole photography and printmaking to explore these relationships.
