Message from Administration

We are pleased to extend the concept of multi-age classrooms beyond the Cree and Ojibwe Language Revitalization programs and into the English program. The benefits of multi-age classrooms far outweigh the perceived drawbacks, it is a progressive approach that offers several unique benefits to students' learning experiences. In a multi-age setting, children of different ages and grade levels share the same classroom, creating a dynamic and collaborative learning environment.

One of the key advantages of multi-age classrooms is personalized learning. Teachers tailor lessons to meet each child's unique developmental needs, allowing students to progress at their own pace. This flexibility helps foster confidence and a love for learning, as children can work on tasks suited to their abilities.

Teachers support your child's reading and writing achievements by providing personalized instruction, fostering a positive learning environment, and using engaging activities to strengthen literacy skills. They offer feedback, monitor progress, and collaborate with parents to ensure consistent development and success.

In a multiage classroom, teachers support math learning by tailoring lessons to each child's level, encouraging peer collaboration, and offering hands-on activities. They create a flexible environment where students progress at their own pace, building confidence and mathematical understanding.

Another benefit is the promotion of social and emotional development. Younger students naturally learn from older peers, while older students develop leadership and mentoring skills as they guide and support their classmates. This structure encourages cooperation and teamwork, nurturing a strong sense of community and belonging.

Multi-age classrooms also enhance long-term relationships with teachers. With students staying in the same classroom for multiple years, teachers gain a deeper understanding of each child's strengths, challenges, and learning style, enabling more effective support and growth.

Incorporating Indigenous education and teaching practices into multiage classrooms fosters a rich, inclusive, and supportive environment where students learn from each other, the land, and their community. The holistic, experiential, and community-oriented aspects of Indigenous teachings align well with the goals of multiage education, promoting growth in a collaborative and respectful manner across different age groups.

Research shows that multi-age classrooms improve academic achievement, self-esteem, and social skills. We believe that this innovative approach offers a more holistic education, preparing students for future academic and personal success.

SAFE ARRIVAL

ABSENCE REPORTING SYSTEM

School Messenger allows parents/guardians to report student absences, late arrivals, early departures and vacations by phone, web or smartphone app. Parents/ guardians will report all absences through School Messenger before 9:00 AM and will not receive a phone call from the school.

For safety reasons, in the event of an unexplained student absence, the system will communicate with parents in a timely manner.

Phone:
