Message from Administration

Isaac Brock's students, staff and families share common values and beliefs and we all work hard to provide students with quality educational programming to meet the diverse needs of all students. We are committed to offer every opportunity to engage our students in meaningful learning experiences. We strive to provide a learning environment that fosters the growth of each student's potential and equitable opportunity to develop the knowledge, skills, and values necessary for meaningful participation in a global and diverse society. Student, parent, staff and community voice is central to our beliefs and the school has an active parent and student council.

Our "One School Vision" is rooted in relationships – with one's self, each other, the community and the natural world. As a community, we are united in creating a better future for all of our students and we are galvanized in a common cause, to redress the legacy of residential schools and advance the process of Canadian reconciliation. Building student, staff, and community capacity for intercultural understanding, empathy, and mutual respect is paramount.

Our goal is to create common learning experiences through an environmental inquiry lens that will shift our Communities' understanding of each other from a basic cultural awareness to a deeper cultural proficiency and appreciation. Using the teachings of the Grandmother Turtle and the 13 Moons she carries, classes have opportunities to participate in cultural programming with an emphasis on getting on the land to participate in environmental inquiry (an Indigenous way of learning). This will also support our vision of learning through play for our early years' students to explore their natural curiosity and increase our middle years/junior high Students' sense of belonging.

At Isaac Brock School, we believe that rich learning experiences will enhance and create a time and place for deep conversations and reflection that will propel students to develop into independent student learners. These beliefs reflect the 4 C's of 21st Century Learners (critical thinking, creativity, collaboration, communication). We offer a robust and rigorous academic curriculum that is rooted in our principles of learning, inclusion, assessment, engagement, collaboration and understating.

Teachers infuse education for sustainable development that involves incorporating key themes of poverty alleviation, human rights, health and environmental protection, and climate change. The school offers students a band program, arts program, outdoor education program and practical arts program. The school has an ever evolving STEAM (Science Technology Engineering Arts and Mathematics) Centre to foster the four Cs along with an abundance of technology to support learning.

Extracurricular activities are an integral part of our school life, fostering a strong sense of student belonging and positive student to student and teacher to student relationships. Relationships are at the foundation of our school experience and we acknowledge that that school has a role to play in supporting a varied experience that supports the developmental needs of adolescents. The school has a volunteer program, Sports Teams including volleyball, basketball, badminton, softball and track and field. There are opportunities for students to perform in school and divisional performances as well.

Lastly, we would like to send a warm welcome to our new staff and students of the 2023-24 school year. We look forward to an amazing and successful year of learning.

Entry times are 8:50 a.m. and 12:40 p.m.


Thank you for helping us by sending your children to school at the appropriate times.

School Safety

Throughout the school year, we practice our emergency response plans. We will have 10 fire drills (one each month), 3 hold and secure practice drills, 3 lockdown practice drills and 1 evacuation drill. Being prepared for an emergency and knowing how to respond appropriately and calmly helps to reassure students that they will be safe.

<u>Fire Drills</u> involve students lining up, walking calmly outside the school and standing with their assigned group. All students and staff will remain outside until school attendance has been taken and an "all clear" signal has been given. One fire drill practice will be held monthly.

In an **<u>evacuation</u>** students will exit the building, (as in a fire drill) school attendance will be taken and then we will proceed to the Valour Community Centre.

In a **lockdown** our goal is safety, care, custody and accountability of children. We will not be able to answer incoming phone calls or allow anyone into the building. Students will be kept quiet, inside classrooms, away from the doors and windows. All students/staff will remain in lockdown mode until an "all clear" signal is given.

During a **hold and secure** all exterior doors will be locked and signs will be placed on the doors indicating that "we are in a hold and secure". No one will be permitted in or out of the building but everything will continue as usual in the school. Recess will be indoors. When safe to do so, we will announce an "all clear" and the exterior doors will be unlocked and signs will be removed.

Please Note: To help ensure the safety of our building, all doors will be locked, except for the front

entrance, daily after 9:15 am. All visitors are asked to report to the office.

All school personnel will be doing their best to ensure that ALL students are being supervised safely at all times in emergency situations. Please discuss with your children their responsibility in keeping themselves safe by listening to the adults and following our emergency procedures.

Student Transportation Services

Parents of students who will be taking the school bus will be required to do the following:

• Inform the Transportation Department at 204-789-0452 when your child will not require bus service for that day.

• Ensure your child is on time for the scheduled bus pick-up and that somebody is there to pick-up your child on time after school. All students who do not have a parent meet them at the stop will be brought back to the school to arrange alternate pickup.

• Inform the school of any changes in address in order to request a new bus route for your child. All new requests to change your transportation pick-up and drop-off locations will take upwards of 2 weeks to come into effect.



• Ensure your child is prepared to practice Safe, Respectful and Responsible behaviour on the bus. Including no standing up without permission, no eating or drinking on the bus, hands and feet to themselves, no vandalizing the bus, etc. Any reports of bus misconduct will be sent to the school to follow up with. Multiple reports could lead to your child being removed from the bus indefinitely.



Dear Parents / Guardians,

Our Grade 7 & 8 students attend Practical Arts classes at Sargent Park School once a cycle, every Day 5 in the morning. Classes begin at 9:00 a.m. and end at 11:15 a.m. Students are expected to find their own transportation to and from Sargent Park School. Public Transit tokens will be available upon request.

Your child will participate in four programs that include: Graphics, Electronics, Clothing/Textiles and Food/Nutrition. The Practical Arts Program has specific expectations and safety guidelines in place in order to keep students and staff safe at all times. Students attending classes at Sargent Park School are expected to follow the Winnipeg School Division Code of Conduct and adhere to all rules. Students are expected to attend regularly and on time and to enter the school using the entrance from the playground side on Dominion Street. Students are then expected to exit Sargent Park School through the Practical Arts doors.

If any student is late for class then please use the Sargent Park Place doors and report immediately to the office to sign in late and pick up a late slip in order to enter class.

Every student will attend classes for 8 weeks in four areas: Graphics/Drafting, Clothing/Textiles, Electronics, and Food/Nutrition. Each student will be given a term mark at the end of this 8 week cycle. A final average mark will be given out in June which will cover the four areas.

Safety precautions are practiced and reviewed, and all students are informed about appropriate dress and needs while in the Practical Arts area. Please note that hoodies with draw strings, long hair, jewellery, flip flops and shorts are not allowed in the Practical Arts Program. This also applies to all electrical devices, phones, IPod, etc.


A small but very important reminder, each student must have a notebook and pencil.

Student behaviour and conduct is also important in the Practical Arts Program. Due to the busy and hands on nature of the work, all students are required to listen and follow instructions, and comply with rules and expectations for behaviour and safety.

Should there be any issue or question about performance, attitude or progress the Practical Arts Teachers will be in contact with you to share information, along with a rubric that will indicate each student's program in the Practical Arts Program.

Grade 9 Students Industrial Arts

Grade 9 students attend Industrial Arts classes at Daniel McIntyre Collegiate every Day 6 in the Afternoon. Classes begin at 1:20. Students are expected to find their own transportation to and from Daniel McIntyre. Public Transit tokens will be available upon request.

Junior High Lunch Program

Junior High students will be required to go home for lunch unless they live more than a 15 minute walk away from the school as per Google Maps. If your child qualifies, they may stay for lunch in a designated classroom and will be supervised by school staff with no additional cost. Please do not send any heat-ups as there will be no microwaves available.

Cree/Ojibwe Bilingual Lunch Program

All students enrolled in the Cree or Ojibwe Bilingual Program will be eligible to stay for lunch with no additional cost. Students will eat lunch in their classrooms and will be supervised by school staff. Students will have recess for half of the hour and eat lunch for the other half. Please do not send any heat-ups as there will be no microwaves available. Plastic cutlery will not be provided.

Lunch Delivery Services

Isaac Brock will no longer accept Skip the Dishes, Door Dash or Uber Eats deliveries for your children. In cases where lunch is forgotten, the school will provide an emergency lunch for your child, or you can choose to drop one off for them.

Tree Planting Workshop

All ages are welcome to join the South Valour Residence Association (SVRA) and Trees Winnipeg for a tree planting workshop at the Isaac Brock School on October 14th between 10:00am-1:00pm. Learn how to properly plant and maintain trees through a 30 minute presentation followed by a Q&A and a demonstration from a trained arborist. Equipment will be provided to attendees who assist with planting 20+ trees at the school. Lunch will be provided to planting participants, with plant-based options provided upon request. Participants will also be entered into a draw for a chance to win a free tree to plant in their yard!

This initiative is made possible by a \$10,000 grant awarded to the SVRA by Trees Canada and The Winnipeg Foundation. The grant encourages and supports community tree planting projects that create long-lasting benefits where people live, work, or play. Trees Winnipeg has partnered with the SVRA to help facilitate the grant planning and execution and to co-host the planting event.



School Supplies



For Nursery through Grade 9, our teachers purchase all the school supplies that students will need for the year. Buying in bulk helps to reduce the costs and buying everything together ensures all students have access to the same quality of supplies. The supply fee for Nursery and Kindergarten is \$40.00 per student and the fee for grades 1-9 is \$50.00 per student. Please pay your fee promptly to your child's homeroom teacher. ABSENCE REPORTING SYSTEM

School Messenger allows parents/guardians to report student absences, late arrivals, early departures and vacations by phone, web or smartphone app. Parents/ guardians will report all absences through School Messenger before 9:00 AM and will not receive a phone call from the school.
