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## School Entry/Patrols/Supervision/School Exit

<u>School officially begins at 9:00 a.m. and 12:45 p.m.</u> Attendance is taken at 9:00 a.m. and 12:45 p.m. Your child will not be marked late unless they arrive after 9:00 a.m. or 12:45 p.m. **Late students MUST sign-in at the office.** 

#### Elementary Students

• Adult supervision begins on the playground at 8:45 a.m.

• Elementary students enter the building at 8:50 a.m.

**A.M.** - Patrols are at their posts at 8:40 a.m. If your children arrive prior to 8:45 a.m. they will be crossing without patrols and they will be unsupervised on the playground.

**P.M.** - In the afternoon, patrols are at their post at 12:30 p.m. and playground supervisors are on duty at 12:30 p.m. School entry is 12:40 p.m. and school starts at 12:45 p.m.

## Isaac Brock Lunch Program

Great News! Winnipeg School Division has made the decision to no longer charge families for Lunch Program going forward.

Lunch hour is from 11:45-12:40– classes resume at 12:45. All students will eat lunch from 11:45-12:15 and then go outside to play for the second half.

All Elementary students are eligible to stay for lunch and will be supervised by internal staff members. All students who wish to stay for lunch **MUST** be registered.

Junior High students (grades 7-9) are expected to go home for lunch if they live within a 15 minute walk from the school.

Lunch Program will work the same way it always has with the following regulations:

- Do not send food with nuts or fish/seafood.
- Microwaves <u>will not</u> be provided so please do not send any food that requires to be heated.
- Send your child with their own cutlery when necessary.
- No Skip the Dishes/Doordash orders.

#### **Student Supply Fees**

For Nursery through Grade 9, our teachers purchase all the school supplies that students will need for the year. Buying in bulk helps to reduce the costs and buying everything together ensures all students have access to the same quality of supplies. The supply fee for Nursery and Kindergarten is \$20.00 per student and the fee for grades 1-9 is \$40.00 per student. Please pay your fee promptly to your child's homeroom teacher. Fees can be paid via cash or cheque payable to Isaac Brock School. Receipts will be issued by the classroom teacher.

We are excited to announce that come September 2024, Valour Community Centre's Isaac Brock site will be home to a fully licensed child care centre. The centre will provide a safe and inclusive space for 45 school-age children and 27 nursery-kindergarten children, offering them a ton of opportunities for growth and development! With access to the community centre amenities such as the gymnasium, playground, and outdoor space, it is a fantastic place for children to grow mentally, physically, and socially.

Currently they are full for grade 1-6 ages and are on a waitlist, however there are 10 more spots for Nursery/Kindergarten ages!





## **School Safety**

Throughout the school year, we practice our emergency response plans. We will have 10 fire drills (one each month), 3 hold and secure practice drills, 3 lockdown practice drills and 1 evacuation drill. Being prepared for an emergency and knowing how to respond appropriately and calmly helps to reassure students that they will be safe.

**Fire Drills** involve students lining up, walking calmly outside the school and standing with their assigned group. All students and staff will remain outside until school attendance has been taken and an "all clear" signal has been given. One fire drill practice will be held monthly.



In an **<u>evacuation</u>** students will exit the building, (as in a fire drill) school attendance will be taken and then we will proceed to the Valour Community Centre.

In a **lockdown** our goal is safety, care, custody and accountability of children. We will not be able to answer incoming phone calls or allow anyone into the building. Students will be kept quiet, inside classrooms, away from the doors and windows. All students/staff will remain in lockdown mode until an "all clear" signal is given.

During a **hold and secure** all exterior doors will be locked and signs will be placed on the doors indicating that "we are in a hold and secure". No one will be permitted in or out of the building but everything will continue as usual in the school. Recess will be indoors. When safe to do so, we will announce an "all clear" and the exterior doors will be unlocked and signs will be removed.

Please Note: To help ensure the safety of our building, all doors will be locked, except for the front entrance, daily after 9:15 am. Parents are to wait for their children to be dismissed with their Teacher outside the building. All visitors are asked to report to the office.

## **Student Transportation Services**

#### Parents of students who will be taking the school bus will be required to do the following:

- Inform the Transportation Department at 204-789-0452 when your child will not require bus service for that day.
- •Ensure your child is on time for the scheduled bus pick-up and that somebody is there to pick-up your child on time after school. All students who do not have a parent meet them at the stop will be brought back to the school to arrange alternate pickup.
- Inform the school of any changes in address in order to request a new bus route for your child. All new requests to change your transportation pick-up and drop-off locations will take upwards of 2 weeks to come into effect.



• Ensure your child is prepared to practice Safe, Respectful and Responsible behaviour on the bus. Including no standing up without permission, no eating or drinking on the bus, hands and feet to themselves, no vandalizing the bus, etc. Any reports of bus misconduct will be sent to the school to follow up with. Multiple reports could lead to your child being removed from the bus indefinitely.

## Grade 7/8 Practical Arts Classes

Our Grade 7 & 8 students attend Practical Arts classes at Sargent Park School once a cycle, every Day 5 in the morning. Classes begin at 9:00 a.m. and end at 11:15 a.m. Students are expected to find their own transportation to and from Sargent Park School. Public Transit tokens will be available upon request.

Your child will participate in four programs that include: Graphics, Electronics, Clothing/Textiles and Food/Nutrition. The Practical Arts Program has specific expectations and safety guidelines in place in order to keep students and staff safe at all times. Students attending classes at Sargent Park School are expected to follow the Winnipeg School Division Code of Conduct and adhere to all rules. Students are expected to attend regularly and on time and to enter the school using the entrance from the playground side on Dominion Street. Students are then expected to exit Sargent Park School through the Practical Arts doors.

If any student is late for class then please use the Sargent Park Place doors and report immediately to the office to sign in late and pick up a late slip in order to enter class.

Every student will attend classes for 8 weeks in four areas: Graphics/Drafting, Clothing/Textiles, Electronics, and Food/Nutrition. Each student will be given a term mark at the end of this 8 week cycle. A final average mark will be given out in June which will cover the four areas.

Safety precautions are practiced and reviewed, and all students are informed about appropriate dress and needs while in the Practical Arts area. Please note that hoodies with draw strings, long hair, jewellery, flip flops and shorts are not allowed in the Practical Arts Program. This also applies to all electrical devices, phones, IPod, etc.

A small but very important reminder, each student must have a notebook and pencil.

Student behaviour and conduct is also important in the Practical Arts Program. Due to the busy and hands on nature of the work, all students are required to listen and follow instructions, and comply with rules and expectations for behaviour and safety.

Should there be any issue or question about performance, attitude or progress the Practical Arts Teachers will be in contact with you to share information, along with a rubric that will indicate each student's program in the Practical Arts Program.

## **Grade 9 Industrial Arts Classes**

Grade 9 students attend Industrial Arts classes at Daniel McIntyre Collegiate every Day 6 in the Afternoon. Classes begin at 1:20. Students are expected to find their own transportation to and from Daniel McIntyre. Public Transit tokens will be available upon request





# SAFE ARRIVAL

School Messenger allows parents/guardians to report student absences, late arrivals, early departures and vacations by phone, web or smartphone app. Parents/ guardians will report all absences through School Messenger before 9:00 AM and will not receive a phone call from the school.

For safety reasons, in the event of an unexplained student absence, the system will communicate with parents in a timely manner.

There are three ways to report an absence:



#### Phone:

Parents/guardians can call the toll free number 1-855-278-4513; listen carefully to all the options, choose the appropriate absence and reason; wait for confirmation number.



#### Internet:

Parents/guardians can log into the website: https://go.schoolmessenger.ca and sign up using the email address on file at Isaac Brock School and a password of your choosing. Absences, late arrivals, early departures and vacations can be reported.



#### iPhone or Android device:

If you would like to use an app on your smart phone: Download the free app through the App Store or Google Play; search School Messenger; install the blue app and sign up using the email address on file at Isaac Brock School and a password of your choosing. Absences, late arrivals, early departures and vacations can be reported.
