FISHING CLUB

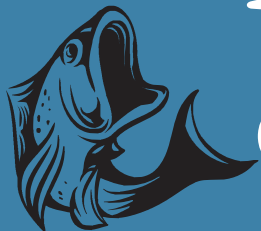

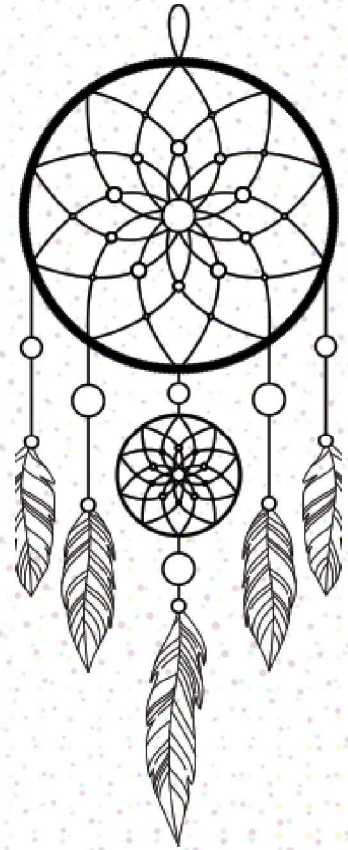
CHOIR

- **Discovery:** Involves an investigation that tests a specific hypothesis using the scientific method.
- **Innovation:** Involves the development and evaluation of innovative devices or models, and/or innovative techniques or approaches in fields such as technology, engineering, or computers, etc.
- **Creative:** Involves exploring unique and imaginative ideas related to science. It focuses on learning new concepts, designing artistic displays, and presenting information in an engaging way.

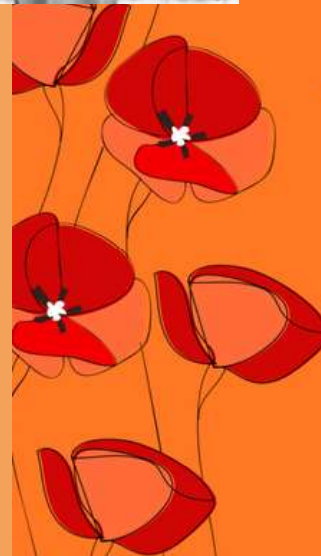

Indigenous Veterans' Day

Indigenous people in Canada have reason to be proud of their wartime contributions. More than 7,000 First Nations members served in the First and Second World Wars and the Korean War, and an unknown number of Inuit, Métis and other Indigenous people also participated. One Veterans group estimates that 12,000 Indigenous men and women served in the three wars

First Nations, Inuit and Metis people were not eligible for conscription because they were not citizens of Canada (they were also unable to vote), but many volunteered despite the challenges they faced, including traveling long distances from remote communities to enlist, learning a new language (English), and coping with racism against them. Indigenous people were not allowed to join the Canadian Air Force until 1942 and the Canadian Navy until 1943. Both men and women enlisted, serving as soldiers, nurses and in other roles. 
