

The Learning Lens

Snowflakes are falling in Room 105


The students in room 105 have been learning all about SNOW! We love to play in the snow; build snow forts, make snow people, sled down a snow hill and make snow angles. Snow can be so much fun, but did you know?

- Snow is frozen water!
- Snow looks white, but is actually clear!
- No two snowflakes are ever the same! You cannot find identical snowflakes, because they are all different!
- All snowflakes start with a "Speck" of dust, ash, pollen, bacteria, or salt.
- Snowflakes have 6 sides because water molecules attach themselves to the "Speck" in groups of 6.
- Fluffy snow is called "powder".
- There are 3 main types of snowflake: Stars, Plates and Columns.
- The Guinness Book of World Record says the world's largest snowflake was 15 inches wide!












We have learned so much about snow through our investigations. We have built snowflakes out of play dough, geoboards, loose parts, and pattern blocks. We designed our very own snowflakes and then created them out of toothpicks and marshmallows, yum! We also collected snow to see how much dirt was in it and made predictions about how much water there would be after our snow melted. We also made predictions about what substance would melt snow the fastest between sugar, salt and baking soda. We have also read many books about snow including all of our favourite Robert Munsch snow books!



The Learning Lens

Journey to Egypt in Room 204

If you could travel back in time, where would you go? The students in Room 204 journeyed all the way back to Ancient Egypt!

Over the past few months, we have been learning about what life was like, long ago in Egypt. We began with a writing prompt, asking questions to people living in Ancient Egypt, and sharing a bit about what living in 2023 is like!



We discovered how the physical geography and the environment can affect the way people live, including what they eat, how they dress, and how they get from place to place. Students worked together to create a map including

many important features, like the Nile River!

Through exploration stations, students created beautiful Egyptian necklace, had the opportunity to use the design

process to construct boats to test on water, contribute to our

very own tomb wall, and learn about the symbols known as hieroglyphics. We practiced cracking messages and then wrote our own names!

Students read informational books and news articles about the famous King Tut! We learned about the mummification process by conducting an experiment to mummify an apple. We weighed the apples before



placing them in salts and then weighed them again after a week. We discovered that the apples shrunk in size and became more flexible!

Learning about the pyramids of Giza fit in perfectly with our geometry unit! We tested the strength of 3D shapes, searched for, and analyzed shapes within our environment and the



structures around us, and of course built pyramids with a variety of materials including Lego, paper, cardboard, blocks and more!


