Here are five ways tobogganing helps our students learn and grow:


- Tobogganing provides a lot of smiles and laughs

Why Regular Attendance Matters

Regular attendance is very important in helping children learn and develop their reading and writing skills. Attending regularly builds strong foundations for all learning that children do in school.

It is very important that children attend school on a regular basis. This will help them continue to grow as a reader and a writer.

Thank you for bringing your child to school on time and every day to help your child succeed!



Attendance Facts

Students need to be present to learn. Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school.

Students who miss 15 days of school per year will miss a year of school before grade 12.

A student with 90% attendance will miss 4 weeks of school per year (2 days a month). This can make it harder to learn to read.

Being 10 minutes late for class each day equals 6 missed days of instruction over the year.

A pattern of absenteeism as early as grade 1 can be a predictor of school dropout.

Children who miss too many days in kindergarten and 1st grade often have ongoing difficulties in reading throughout their years in school.
