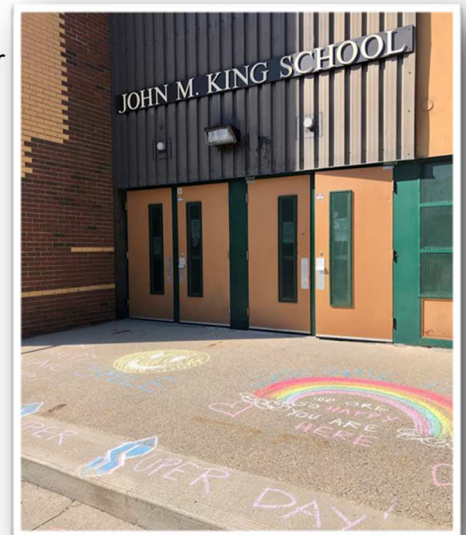

Learning Lens

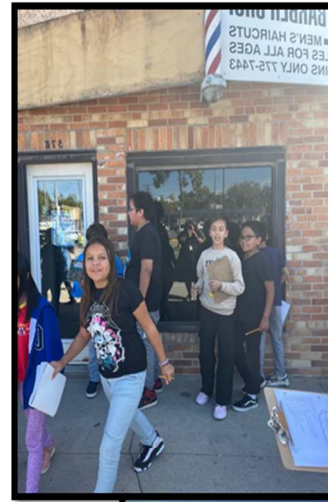

Our classes began our inquiry journey by going on a walk around the community to look for “things that make our lives easier”. On our walk, we saw many things such as ramps, electrical boxes, bikes, cars, stairs, security cams, etc. After making lists of the things we saw, we realized that many of them included electricity and simple machines! So we began to ask questions...

We found answers to our questions using videos, articles, books and through exploration. We learned that there are 6 different simple machines (wedge, screw, inclined plane, pulley, wheel and axle, and lever). Through various design challenges, we learned how they can be combined to make work easier.

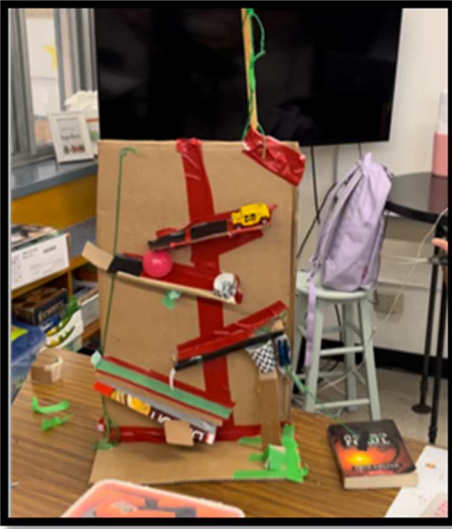
We also explored with components of electrical circuits, made our own working paper circuits, and discussed the importance of electrical safety!

As a final project, students will be applying their knowledge to create an arcade game that includes the arcade game that includes simple machines and one working electrical component! On Nov 3rd our classes will visit Uptown Alley to see how machines and electricity are used. We hope to get many interesting ideas for our upcoming projects!



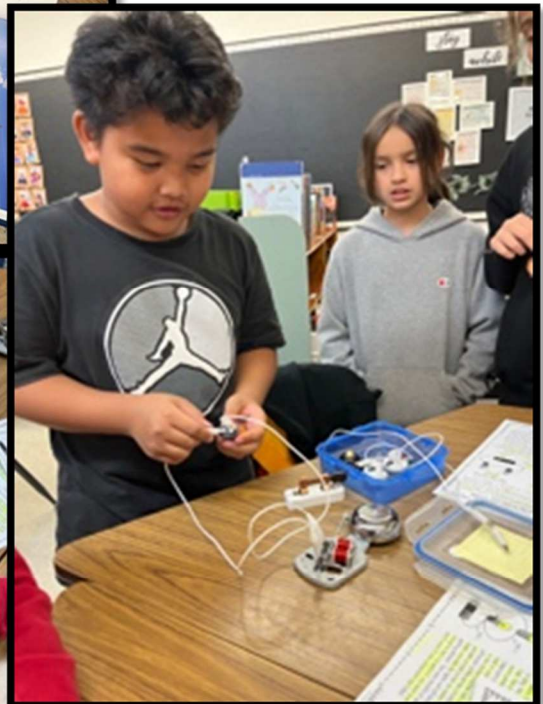
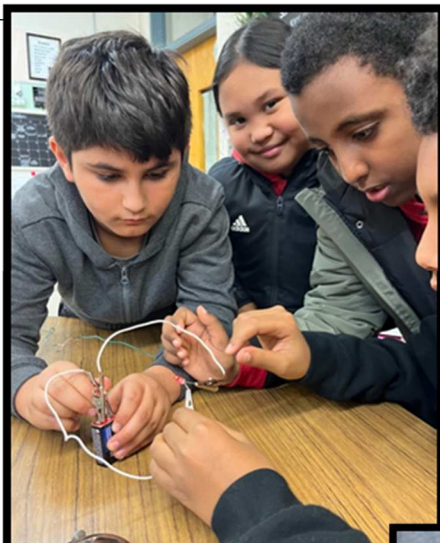
Using pulleys to lift up a chair!

208 applied their knowledge to create their own Rube Goldberg Machines – A chain reaction device to complete a simple task in an inefficient way. Their task was to use all 6 simple machines to open a book!

203 created Halloween pictures to go with their Halloween stories. We drew silhouettes and then dipped it into sprayed marker to create a spooky effect! We then used copper tape, LED lights and coin batteries to make our artwork light up!
