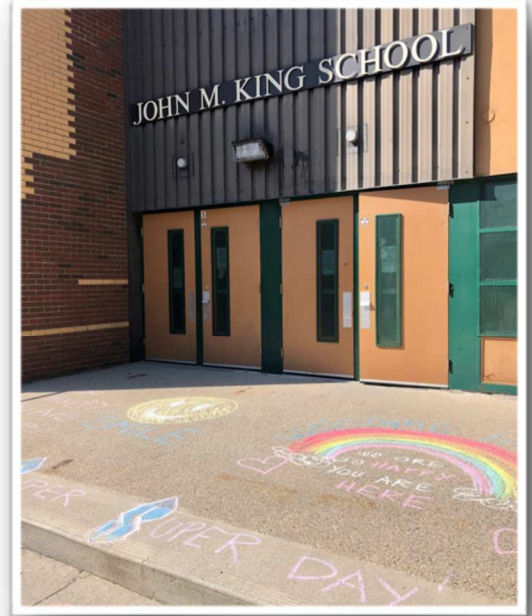

This year we kicked off our physical education classes by exploring both new and familiar equipment, participating in recess games, and getting reacquainted with group games and activities. Classes have been taking place both inside the gym and in the schoolyard. Students at John M. King School participate in 30 minutes of physical education each school day. Our classes consist of a warm up, skill practice and activity, and culminate in a reflection on learning. Every Friday, students participate in Fun Friday!, where they are encouraged to explore the activities they enjoyed most during the week.

During phys. ed classes, we encourage independent practice, team work, skill building, and connection amongst peers. Physical activity helps students maintain their focus and attention throughout the school day, reduce anxiety, and assist in building relationships with peers.

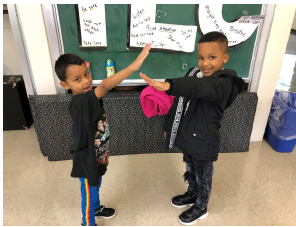

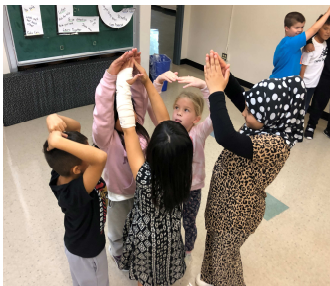


PERFORMING ARTS

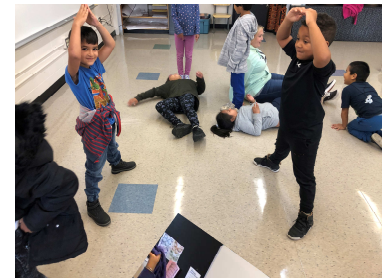
Hello! My name is Gordon Tanner and I am very excited to be the new Performing Arts teacher at John M. King! You may be wondering how Performing Arts is different from Music class. In Performing Arts students will be learning about Drama and Dance, as well as Music. Our music program already contained lots of drama and dance activities, so this really isn't a huge change from what students have experienced previously. During September we focused on Drama and learning games and activities to help us build our classroom communities. We learned that the word "ensemble" means "together", and that the performing arts often requires us to work together as an ensemble. Some games that we have learned so far include the Name Game, Atom, Telephone, Magic Rocks and Pruie. Every class at John M King has been learning a song called *Music Alive* written by Cree composer Sherryl Sewepagaham. The song is written in English and Cree, and we sang it together during our school assembly on September 29th to honour the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on September 30. The message of the song is that music is a powerful way of bringing people together, and that young people have a very important role in creating those connections.

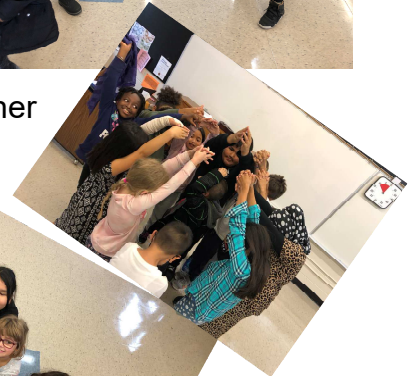
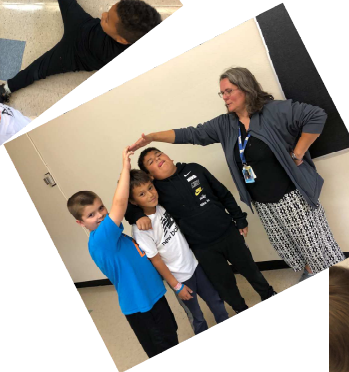

September has been a very busy month for Room 106. We have welcomed lots of new friends as they have joined our classes since the start of the school year. If you are new to the John M. King community, we would like to welcome you.

Our learning in Room 106 has focused on getting to know each other, learning the routines and rules of our classroom and developing some independence at school. We have been learning to share, take turns and play together. Through this play we have been developing friendships while we explore the many exciting centres in our classroom. Some of our favourites this year have included the Kitchen Centre, Playdoh Centre, Lego Centre, Arts and Crafts Centre and the Car Centre. We talked about our classroom responsibilities to make sure that our whole class was able to enjoy each centre as we play and learn. We simplified all of our rules into three main responsibilities that apply to our whole classroom. 1) We will be safe. 2) We will keep our hands and feet to ourselves. 3) We will use kind words and actions.



The class has been learning about what makes us all unique and special. We have been learning about ourselves as well as other people in the class. We've talked about our names, our birthdays and things that we like. Through these discussions we've noticed that we all have a lot in common. These similarities have brought us together as a group and we have created a great classroom community in both the morning and the afternoon classes. Talking about ourselves has also given us the opportunity to appreciate how we are different from each other as well. We are learning that we are all unique and special and that it is okay to be different. These differences give us great opportunities to learn from one another and experience different things.



The first day of Autumn gave us an opportunity to begin learning about the seasons and what changes we notice. We noticed that the weather was getting colder and that the leaves were starting to fall from the trees. We also noticed that the leaves were changing colours! We explored some leaves outside on the playground and in the classroom as well. We noticed that leaves came in many different shapes, sizes and colours. Once we noticed that, we began talking about sorting different objects around the classroom.

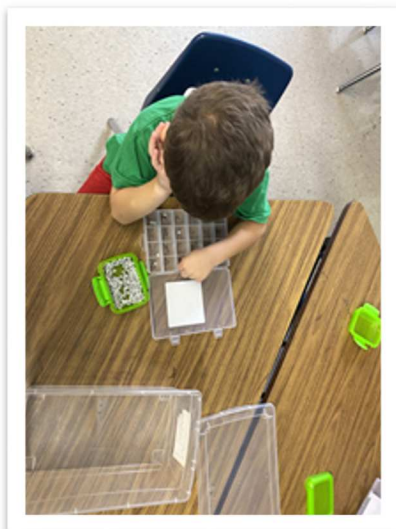


Back to School with Room 102!!

Dear John M. King Families,

Smudging is a tradition, common to many First Nations, which involves the burning of one or more medicines gathered from the earth. The four sacred medicines used in First Nations' ceremonies are tobacco, sage, cedar, and sweetgrass. The most common medicines used in a smudge are sweetgrass, sage, and cedar. Smudging has been passed down from generation to generation. There are many ways to perform a smudge and different variations exist. Historically, Métis and Inuit people did not smudge; however, today many Métis and Inuit people have incorporated smudging into their lives.

Smudging allows people to stop, slow down, and become mindful and centered. This allows people to remember, connect, and be grounded in the event, task, or purpose at hand. Smudging also allows people to let go of negative feelings and thoughts. Letting go of things that inhibit a person from being balanced and focused comes from the feeling of being calm and safe while smudging. The forms of smudging will vary from nation to nation but are considered by all to be a way of cleansing oneself. Smudging is part of "the way things are done" and is part of living a good life.

Beginning on Tuesday, October 10, we would like to give students the opportunity to smudge before the start of the school day. This will be taking place between the hills on the schoolyard, at 8:45am. I will lead the smudge, and we will use sage. Smudging is voluntary, and all students, parents, and caregivers are welcome to join us.
