About Kent Road School

Nestled in the heart of the East Elmwood community, Kent Road School has been proudly serving families for over 60 years. With approximately 250 students from Nursery to Grade 6, we are a vibrant, inclusive school where deep relationships, joyful learning, and a strong sense of community are at the heart of everything we do. We are a multi-age school, meaning students from different grade levels learn together in the same classroom. This model nurtures a strong sense of belonging, builds leadership and collaboration skills, and allows students to grow in a supportive, student-centered environment. It's a key part of what makes our school feel like a family. We take great pride in our students — we lovingly call them 'Kent Road Kids', and we think deeply about what it means to be one. Kent Road Kids are kind, inclusive, curious, engaged, and full of joy and playfulness. They have unique gifts, and they know they are loved, valued, and that they truly belong here. Our students aren't just learning skills — they're learning who they are and how they can make a difference. At Kent Road, we're committed to giving every child a strong foundation in literacy and numeracy, while also embracing progressive, experiential methods. Our teaching practices include land-based learning, inquirybased thinking, and hands-on experiences that allow students to think, act, and feel like readers, writers, mathematicians, scientists, artists, global citizens, and more! And perhaps most importantly, we know we are stronger together. We work in close partnership with our families to make sure everyone feels welcome, valued, and experiences belonging in our school community. Welcome to Kent Road — a place where pride runs deep, joy is abundant, and every child is known!

- Various student nurses from the university did practicums within our school and students learned about relevant health topics
- During Earth Week we had visits from Earth Rangers, Take Pride Winnipeg, and Monarch Teacher Network
- School-wide common area training was provided after each school break
- We attended WSD's STEAM Fair at Alloway Hall
- We attended the Winnipeg International Storytelling Festival
- We partnered with United for Literacy to support students reading skills
- We held our annual Winter Concert
- Students participated in a Winter Craft Extravaganza Day
- We held a Community Pancake Feast for Winter Equinox and a Community Feast in June for Summer Solstice
- All Gr. 1 students received a Kits for a Cause book bag with books and activities
- Two students attended Cop Shop at St. Vital Mall with members of WPS
- We had 10 Pizza Lunches to help fundraise for our school
- Several guests from the community and WSD read to students for I Love to Read Month
- We held our 1st Honour Walk to bring awareness to MMIWG+ in our community
- Our Gr. 4 students participated in the Swimming Counts Program
- We had performances from the Elmwood Band and Choir, Royal Winnipeg Ballet, and the School of Contemporary Dance
- Spirit Week was planned by our Student Leadership Team and enjoyed by all
- We visited the Human Rights Museum, the Indigo Bookstore, Landmark Cinemas, Manitoba Theatre for Young People, Morning Sound Farm, U of W Faculty of Science, Birds Hill Park, Assiniboine Park, Panam Pool, Transcona Aquatic Park, the Munroe Public Library, Boston Pizza, The Manitoba Museum, the Zoo, a Goldeyes Game, and more

School priorities from the past school year:

Inclusion:

Students will demonstrate increased language skills with a school-wide focus on Phonemic Awareness skills.

Our goal is to cultivate a culture of high expectations and deep learning across all classrooms, where Kent Road Kids are actively engaged in meaningful learning experiences led by passionate educators. We will invite students to be curious and deeply engaged in real-world tasks and conversations where they behave like readers, authors, mathematicians, scientists, artists, engineers (and more!) in a relevant and enduring way.



Family & Community Involvement

At Kent Road School, Families and Community serve as partners in learning and in developing each child as an engaged member of society. We continue to welcome many new families from all over Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada and the World.
