Make sure your child comes home immediately after dismissal so they can cross with the patrols. For your child's safety, remind them to obey the patrols at all times. The patrol supervisor is **Ms. Behma**.

### Daycare Spaces Available

The Munroe ECEC Daycare located in room 18 of the school currently has spaces available for students in grades 1-6. Please drop in or give us a call at 204-793-7626. We are open at 6:30 am until 9:00, and then from 3:30 pm until 6:00 pm. We are also open all day during school closure days.

### Breakfast Club

This year will be the 10th year for our breakfast program. We are very excited that the program has become so popular since it started. The Breakfast Program is a great way to get to school on time and have a nutritional start to the day. The kids who attend enjoy meeting with their peers in a mellow and friendly environment.

The continued success of this program means we will continue to offer free nutritional breakfasts, Monday to Friday. We ask that students enter through the back doors by the gym, **NOT THE MAIN DOORS**. Also it is very important to make sure that your children do not leave home too early as the doors for the breakfast program are only open as of 8:30 and there is no supervision outside until 8:50 am. Children will not be allowed to wait in the halls until the Breakfast Program opens.

Part of the success of the Breakfast Program is achieved by getting volunteers between 8-9 am to help prepare, serve and clean. It is a great way to meet and get to know the students and it's a lot of fun. If you would like to volunteer, please contact the office at 204-669-1228.

### Administering Medication to Students

We know that from time to time, children need to receive medication while at school, and we're happy to oblige, within Winnipeg School Division guidelines. There is a form which you will need to fill out. As well, when you send the medication to school, it must be in the **original prescription bottle with the child's name on it**. 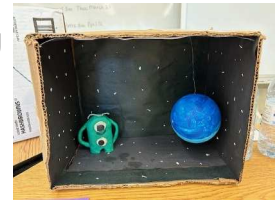
This month in Math some students have been focusing on patterns with shapes, objects and numbers. Also creating their own patterns and write algebraic expressions to reflect pattern rules.

Hello friends,

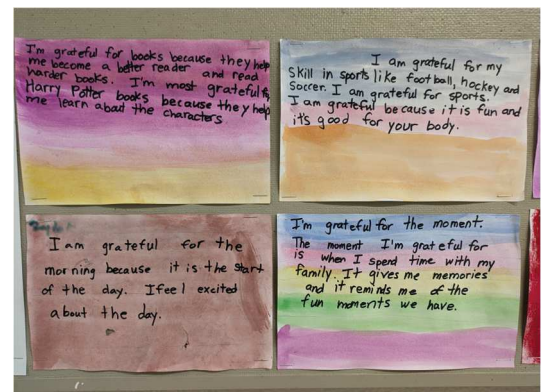
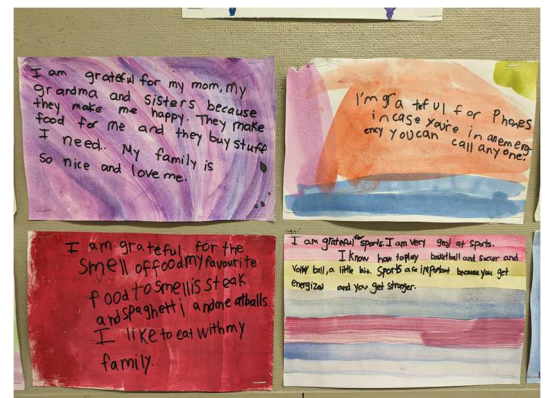
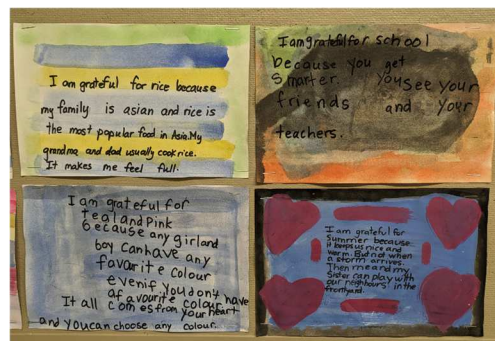
March has flown by, as have two thirds of the school year!

## Music News

### MUSIC – April Newsletter

This past month we have been studying the music of Edvard Grieg. He wrote music to go along with the Norwegian folktales of the boy Peer Gynt. One of our favorites, “In the Hall of the Mountain King” features how Peer, thinking he could become the next King of the trolls, needs to escape the mountain before he is caught and forced to live the rest of his life like a troll. We played accompaniment non-pitched percussion instruments to the music and acted out the story through mime and music.

Many students have enjoyed the dance for the month “In the Dark”. In April, the students will have the opportunity to explore music and dances from different countries and cultures. We will also start to create our own dances in small groups.

We have started our enrichment dance project with the Royal Winnipeg Ballet instructor. Students in grades 3-6 were able to sign up for 30 min dance lesson once a cycle with the dance instructor. They class will run until the end of June. I look forward to finding out what music we will be using and learning the dance.

The students in Grades 3-6 have been practising recorder melodies using a Question and Answer style strategy. It has been exciting to hear the musical tonalities and variety of melodies they can make up on the spot. They sound great!!

We have begun to experiment with drama: mime movements and actions and hope to include some readers theatre in the next month.

Harvest Manitoba's Income Tax Return Program can help you to prepare and file your income tax and benefit return.

If you have a modest income and a simple tax situation you may qualify for this program\*.

Contact us and trained Harvest volunteers will file your tax return for **FREE between February 26th and May 30th, 2024.**

*Modest Income:* Single household income under \$35,000 or  
Couple household income under \$45,000 (+\$2,500 per dependent)

Simple tax situation excludes:

- Professional or business income
- Rental income and expenses
- Capital gains or losses
- Investment income over \$1,000
- Farming or fishing income
- Deceased returns
- Pre and post bankruptcy return
- Foreign property

An Innovative Recovery Housing Project

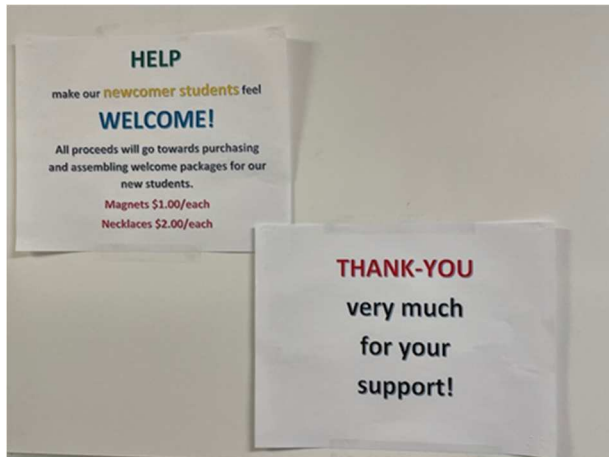
