### Patrols

School safety patrols will be on duty each day at 8:40 am, 12 noon, 12:55 pm and 3:30 pm. Please send your child when patrols are on post. Make sure your child comes home immediately after dismissal so they can cross with the patrols. For your child's safety, remind them to obey the patrols at all times. The patrol supervisor is **Ms. Behma**.

### Daycare Spaces Available

The Munroe ECEC Daycare located in room 18 of the school currently has spaces available for students in grades 1-6. Please drop in or give us a call at 204-793-7626. We are open at 6:30 am until 9:00, and then from 3:30 pm until 6:00 pm. We are also open all day during school closure days.

### Breakfast Club

This year will be the 10th year for our breakfast program. We are very excited that the program has become so popular since it started. The Breakfast Program is a great way to get to school on time and have a nutritional start to the day. Please remember that our Breakfast Co-ordinator only starts at 8:00. **Students are welcome to attend after 8:20 am.**

The continued success of this program means we will continue to offer free nutritional breakfasts, Monday to Friday. We ask that students enter through the back doors by the gym, **NOT THE MAIN DOORS**. Also it is very important to make sure that your children do not leave home too early as the doors for the breakfast program are only open as of 8:30 and there is no supervision outside until 8:50 am. Children will not be allowed to wait in the halls until the Breakfast Program opens.

Part of the success of the Breakfast Program is achieved by getting volunteers between 8-9 am to help prepare, serve and clean. It is a great way to meet and get to know the students and it's a lot of fun. If you would like to volunteer, please contact the office at 204-669-1228.

### Health Care Plans

Every child with special health care needs, such as a puffer, prescription medication or an EpiPen, requires a health care plan. The plan gives detailed information so the school may respond quickly.

It is a parent responsibility to inform the school about the health care needs of their child. If your child's plan has changed, please notify the school.

### Administering Medication to Students

We know that from time to time, children need to receive medication while at school, and we're happy to oblige, within Winnipeg School Division guidelines. There is a form which you will need to fill out. As well, when you send the medication to school, it must be in the **original prescription bottle with the child's name on it**. Call the office for more information.

We collected some wild rhubarb leaves on the playground and are pressing them with hopes that we can do paintings on them when they are dry. We have been playing some fun games to help us with reading our words as well as adding and subtracting. We have also continued to talk about water and our need to protect it as we learn about the water cycle and how lucky we are to have clean and safe drinking water. This week we are reading the book Nibi's Water Song and learning that there are lots of people, mostly First Nation's People that do not have clean drinking water. We will be writing letters to the Prime Minister asking him why. We will also be doing some research and conducting experiments on how to clean dirty polluted water.

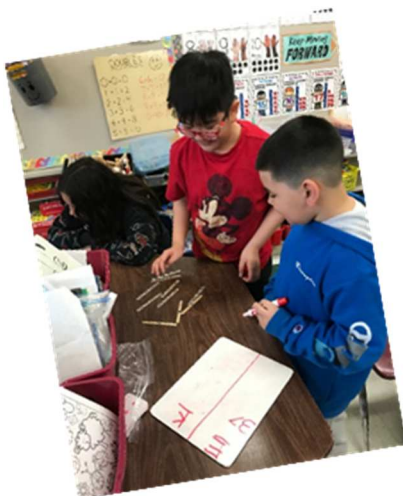
### Room 4

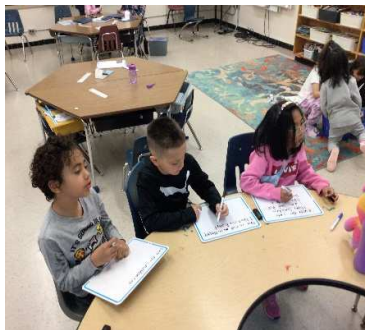


## Room 6

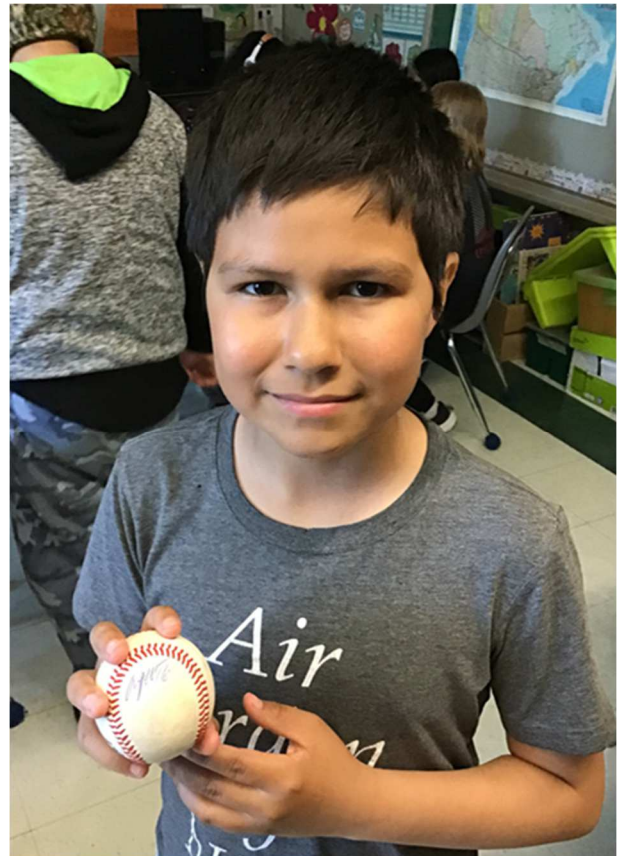
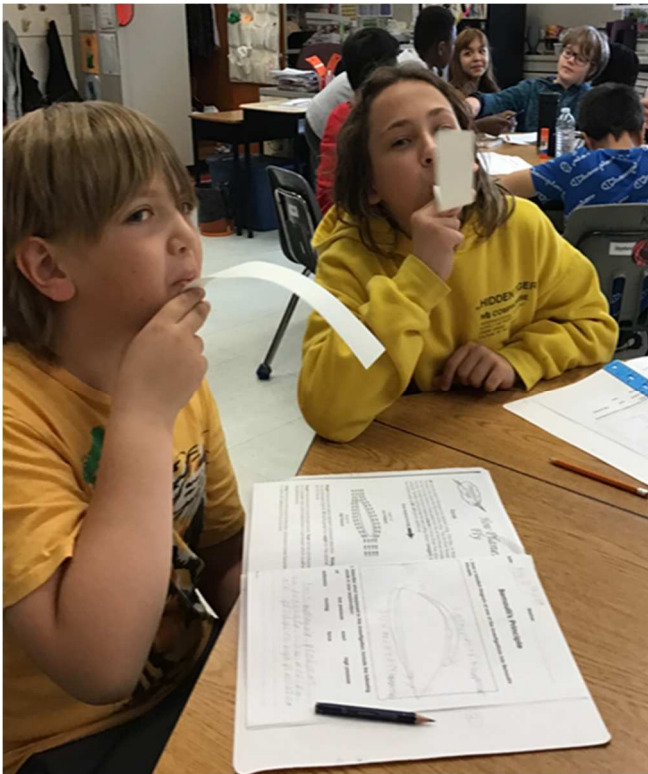

## Room 14

Room 14 has been so busy in May! In science, students used broken crayons to learn about the rock cycle. First students shaved the crayons into piles of colored shavings (eroded rock into sediment). Then they pressed the shavings together to make sedimentary "rocks". Adding a bit of heat and pressure from their hands, they changed the sedimentary "rock" into metamorphic "rock". Then we heated the rock even more, and turned it into liquid "rock" (lava or magma). Once the liquid hardened, it formed igneous "rock". Some students even asked to begin the cycle again! And we finally got to taste our delicious rock candy crystals this month after waiting weeks for them to form.

We also had our very last field trip to The Leaf and the Zoo where we presented our culminating projects (our terrariums) to the rest of the Goodman School classes. Congratulations to Elham, Rafif and Beulah for presenting our project for us!

In social studies, while learning about Canada's North, we built igloos, used chalk pastels to draw the Northern Lights, and we will be building Inuksuit and representing the ways of life of the Inuit in our dioramas.

We are looking forward to wrapping up these units soon, and building some more choice into our days with some student led projects and learning.

As the weather warms up, students need more and more water breaks. It would help greatly if students could bring a water bottle to school that can be filled a couple of times a day instead of leaving the class for water multiple times per day. You can imagine how disruptive this can be. Please send a reusable bottle to school each day labelled with your child's name.

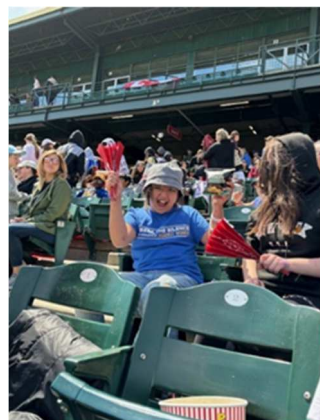

### The Refuge

It is a mentor-based program that provides support groups based on different circumstances and needs. We offer general support to moms, and specific group supports to women dealing with domestic violence and addiction issues.

We partner with Harvest Manitoba to provide groceries to Elmwood families every week. Our food bank runs every Wednesday from 2-7pm, and on Thursdays from 11am-1pm we offer a drop-in soup lunch!
