The Munroe ECEC Daycare located in room 6 of the school currently has spaces available for students in grades 1-6. Please drop in or give us a call at 204-793-7626. We are open at 6:30 am until 9:00, and then from 3:30 pm until 6:00 pm. We are also open all day during school closure days.

### Breakfast Club

This year will be the 10th year for our breakfast program. We are very excited that the program has become so popular since it started. The Breakfast Program is a great way to get to school on time and have a nutritional start to the day. The kids who attend enjoy meeting with their peers in a mellow and friendly environment.

The continued success of this program means we will continue to offer free nutritional breakfasts, Monday to Friday. We ask that students enter through the back doors by the gym, **NOT THE MAIN DOORS**. Also it is very important to make sure that your children do not leave home too early as the doors for the breakfast program are only open as of 8:30 and there is no supervision outside until 8:50 am. Children will not be allowed to wait in the halls until the Breakfast Program opens.

Part of the success of the Breakfast Program is achieved by getting volunteers between 8-9 am to help prepare, serve and clean. It is a great way to meet and get to know the students and it's a lot of fun. If you would like to volunteer, please contact the office at 204-669-1228.

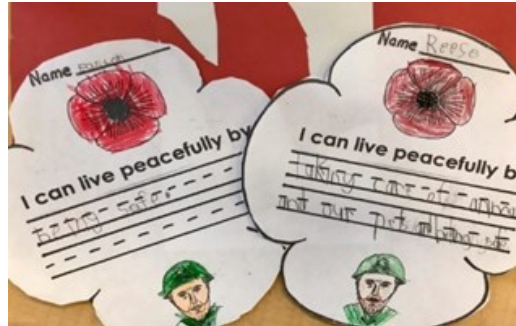

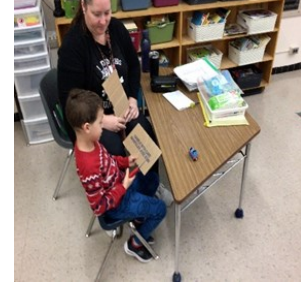


## Room 6

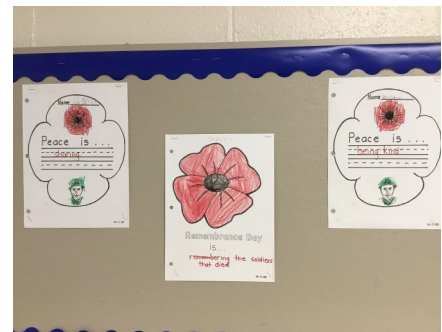
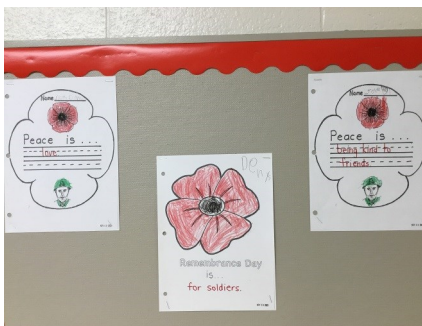
## Room 7

## Room 10

Hello Room 10 Families!

November was a busy month of learning! It was lovely to meet so many families at Parent-Teacher Conferences.

In ELA we have been working on novel studies – Charlie and the Chocolate Factory or The Barren Grounds. This month in Math we have been some students have been focusing on estimation strategies- rounding, compatible numbers and compensation. While other students have been learning about the order of operations.

We also learned a lot about Remembrance Day and focused lessons on Canada's history at the time of confederation.

Reminder that students should be doing the following for homework: home reading logs, spelling practice and Xtra Math practice. Students can practice their basic math facts to mastery using the Xtra-Math.org website! This is so important so that students can solve multi-digit questions with ease.



## Room 11

Past month has been busy and productive month of learning in Room 11.

In Math, the students are continuing to learn how to relate decimals and fractions to money. Our play with "Room 11 Store" math game has proven to be successful. The students enjoy playing the game that strengthens their knowledge of basic math facts and are learning new strategies for solving problems. In ELA, we have been working on a spelling program. The students have words in their agenda to study at home daily. Congratulations to the majority of the students in Room 11 for doing great in spelling. We have a great reading time with our reading/book buddies in grade  $\frac{1}{2}$  and we meet with them once a cycle to read books.

## Room 14

November has been a busy month in Room 14! I had the opportunity to attend a PD on how to use Minecraft Education in the classroom, and the students are SO engaged in creating our zoo collaboratively. They are also writing an adapted fairy-tale in Minecraft where they have to create the setting, and create NPCs (non-player characters) who use dialogue to tell the story. Students will be doing a screen capture of this story and posting it to Google classroom for you to see later this month.

We have also been examining place value with students. They are decomposing (breaking numbers down) into ones, tens, hundreds, and for those who are ready, thousands and ten thousands! Place value is a critical understanding in all math processes, so knowing how to build numbers in non-standard form is something we will be examining until the break. For example, the number 326 could be made with 3 hundreds, 2 tens and 6 ones, or 2 hundreds, 12 tens and 6 ones. See Google Classroom for pictures of your kiddos building numbers!

With only a few weeks until Winter Break, we will soon turn our attention to preparing for the Winter Concert. Students are busy practicing their songs, and we will be creating visual art to decorate for the concert. Please check your email as I will be sending costume information home shortly.

## Room 15

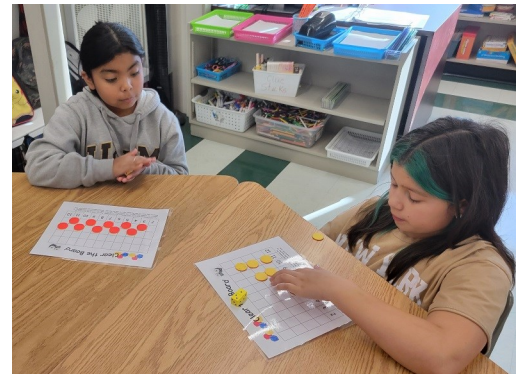

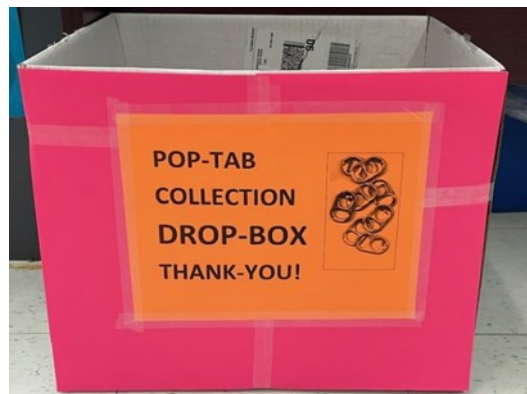

A Reminder from Resource

The Mobile Vision Care Clinic (MVCC) will be back at Kent Road School in January to assess the vision needs of our students. They give a full comprehensive eye exam and provide our children with glasses if needed.

## MOBILE VISION CARE CLINIC (MVCC)



The Winnipeg School Division is working with Mobile vision Care Clinic (MVCC) to bring eye doctors to Kent Road School to test your child(ren)'s eye sight to make sure their eyes are healthy.

One in three children entering school cannot see very well. Many children do not know they could see more clearly. The Canadian Association of Optometrists recommends that children visit an optometrist every year after starting school.

An Optometrist and a team of wee care professionals will come to Kent Road School to give a **FREE** full comprehensive eye exam and provide children with glasses, if needed on **January 16-20, 2023**.

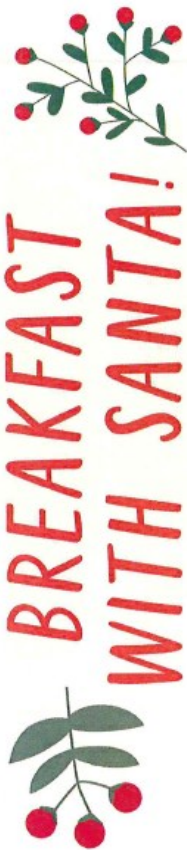

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

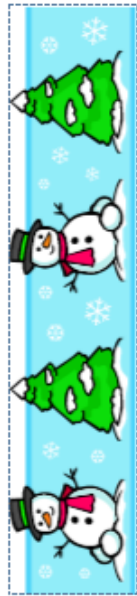
