Dear Kent Road Families,

Welcome back new and returning families. We had an amazing start as over 235 students got used to their teachers, classrooms, routines, and expectations for learning and behaviour. So far, we have had a welcome back assembly and common area training so we know what to do in each area of the school. We also had an informed fire, lock down, hold and secure and evacuation drill so we know what to do in case of an emergency. The Breakfast Program is up and running. All students are invited to attend daily after 8:30 until 8:45am.

Thank you to everyone who contributed to our Farm to School fundraiser. Please join us at our first Parent Council meeting on October 11 in the library at 6:30 pm. Child care will be provided. Your voice matters. This is an opportunity to contribute to school decisions and support enrichment activities and school wide initiatives (e.g. Community Feast).

Our school has seen a lot of changes since June. From new classrooms and staff to new learning spaces. Read the newsletter to find out more about the flower boxes out front and our courtyard project. We are also excited to share space with our daycare partnership and the new Sensory Room. Many of our students will directly benefit from this inclusive space. Thank you to Mel and her team for securing the \$50 000 grant to create this unique space.

Our newsletter is our main form of communication. It allows us to showcase student learning and other activities occurring throughout the building. our newsletter is posted on our website your child must have media release permission to be featured. As well, if your child does not have publications permission their photo can not featured in the school. Please consider this as it is difficult to ask a child to remove themselves from school wide photos and often makes them feel excluded, especially at year end events where they do not see themselves celebrated with their classmates.



Check the monthly calendar for all the exciting events we have planned to enrich your child's learning and build their sense of belonging this year. A paper copy will be sent home so your child does not miss out. We have several children with life threatening allergies, if you wish to send a snack for the whole class for a special occasion, please check with your child's teacher first.

As the weather has become cooler please remember to send appropriate clothing for recess (e.g. rain boots, jacket, mitts...) as we go outside rain or shine unless its below -27 outside. We also recommend having a change of clothes (especially socks) should the need arise. Being wet and cold is the worst. We are in desperate need of

clean, gently worn pants in sizes 4-8 and all size mitts and/or gloves.

Please be assured that your child's safety and success at school are my number one priority. Should you have any questions/ concerns about the classroom (work, behaviour, peer issues) please contact your child's teacher first. The home-school partnership is key to your child's continued success. Looking forward to a great year.

THE ARTS

Grades 1-2

Students in grade 1-2 will focus on the fundamentals of music education, starting with the basics, such as: steady beat, simple rhythms, using their singing voices, simple melodic contours, simple music language and beginning notation. They will focus on the five main aspects of the music education Orff Schulwerk approach (sing, play, dance, create, and explore).

Grade 3-6

Students in grades 3-6 will continue their music education with a more focused approach. Students will experience the basic fundamentals of music education in more depth. They will be able to apply the fundamentals in many different music situations. This year students in grades 3-6 will practice musical pieces on their recorders in accordance with the other instruments in the class, their vice, and with movement.

Assessment

Students are expected to actively participate so that accurate assessments can be made on their growth and development in music., dance and drama

Students will be assessed in accordance with the Manitoba K -8 Arts Education curriculum. The curriculum is organized into a "butterfly".



We will be exploring dance and drama this year. Students will learn to name their movements, rehearse, and prepare for showcasing their work. They will learn how to choreograph, being mindful of what the movements are and how they relate to creative expression.

Students will be given opportunities to make, create, connect and respond to a variety of dances, movement, drama and acting this year.

The Arts are a part of everything we do, it is expressive, dynamic, thoughtful, and includes the core subjects of Math, Language, Science and the Humanities.











Health Care Plans

Every child with special health care needs, such as a puffer, medication or Epipen, an requires a health care plan. The plan gives detailed information so the school may respond quickly.

It is a parent responsibility to inform the school about the health care needs of their child. If your child's plan has changed, please notify the school.

Administering Medication to Students

We know that from time to time, children need to receive medication while at school, and we're happy to oblige, within Winnipeg School Division guidelines. There is a form which you will need to fill out. As well, when you send the medication to school, it must be in the original prescription bottle with the child's name on it. Elementary Assessment Processes

Teachers are expected to use a variety of strategies such as observation, hands on tasks, open ended paper tasks and interviews with individuals, small group and whole groups of students. The information gathered provides the teacher with data about a student's strengths and areas requiring support. The teacher plans differentiated instruction to address the learning needs of the students early in the year. Teachers then set learning goals to meet the programming needs of all the students in their classrooms using the data obtained from the assessment.
