February is Black History Month, a meaningful time for students to learn about and celebrate the contributions and stories of Black individuals throughout history. We encourage conversations at home that reinforce the values of inclusion, respect, and appreciation for diversity.

Absences must be recorded <u>before 8:30am,</u> and planned absences may be reported in advance.


