

MESSAGE FROM ADMINISTRATION:

As we enter November, a time for reflection, we approach a meaningful day in our calendar — Remembrance Day. As we honor this solemn occasion, let us remember the words of John Maxwell Edmonds: "When you go home, tell them of us and say, for your tomorrow, we gave our today."

It is a time for all of us to pause and reflect on the sacrifices that have given us the rights, freedoms, and privileges we enjoy as Canadians. On Friday, November 8th at 10:30 a.m., we will gather in our gymnasium for a special Remembrance Day service. Poppies will be distributed to students, and donations can be made at the office the week prior. We encourage all attendees to wear red or black in remembrance. Students who are part of Brownies, Girl Guides, Cubs, Beavers, Scouts, and Cadets are invited to proudly wear their uniforms to the service.

In addition to honoring this important occasion, our teachers have been hard at work observing, assessing, and evaluating students' progress over the last two months.

We would also like to take a moment to reflect on the wonderful community events we've shared this fall. Our Terry Fox Run in late September was a great success! Thanks to your generosity, we raised \$266 for the Terry Fox Foundation in support of cancer research. A heartfelt thank you to everyone who participated in this year's chocolate fundraiser. Your efforts truly made a difference, and we are so grateful for your support.

As we move further into the colder months, we want to remind families to send students to school dressed for winter. Students will be outside three times a day, unless weather conditions are extreme.
