In February, we recognize and celebrate the lives and contributions of Black Canadians during Black History Month. We embrace cultural and linguistic diversity at our school and stand against racism in all its forms.


I LOVE TO READ MONTH

We recognize February 2024 as "I Love to Read Month." We celebrate the importance and joy of reading. This year's theme is "**Our Voices are Unique.**" According to the <u>Reading Council of Greater Winnipeg</u>, the theme helps readers "develop a deeper understanding of different perspectives" and "understand the importance of being their true selves."

Each Friday in February, we will celebrate *I love to Read* with dress-up days:

February 9: Read my Shirt

- Wearing a shirt with appropriate writing on it!
- February 16: Hats off to reading
 - Wear your favourite hat!
- February 23: Dress as your favourite character
 - Come to school dressed as your favourite character from your favourite book!



During the month of February, students keep track of the number of minutes that they read. The challenge is to record 500 minutes during the month.

In addition, each Friday, we will have a "Mystery Reader." Students will tune in to the reading of a picture book by a guest from the Luxton school community.

Additionally, we continue to learn how to play recorders, read written music notation, and play songs that include notes A, B and G in multiple rhythm patterns and values (1,2,3,4 beats notes and rests). There is so much to learn, and students polish and perfect their musical skills during every practice!

Choir continues to meet every day 6, and a little bird told me that they can be heard all the way to the third floor from the basement (3) They are such a brilliant, talented and dedicated team!!! Way to Go!!!




