MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Hello Luxton Families!

At the beginning of the year, our staff reviewed our strengths and the opportunities this year would present, and we set goals about *building community*. During the month of October, we have had a number of initiatives to develop a sense of belonging at Luxton. Here are some examples:

- celebrating learning in the classroom
- intermural soccer
- dance and drawing clubs
- Kuamini leadership club
- field trips to the inner-city science center
- swimming

There are many more examples. Collectively, we want students, staff, and parents at Luxton to develop a strong community of learning.

We're looking forward to communicating with caregivers in person about students' progress and achievement in the upcoming Triconferences. Triconferences are meetings between the teacher, parent/guardian, and the student. Please remember that Luxton is fragrance free!

Please note that there are slight changes in the way we will be writing report card comments. In the past, teachers had been told not to assign performance levels that were low on the scale if children were not reading or doing math at grade level, but instead to write a separate learning plan. We will continue to write a plan for student success, but will also use the whole grading scale. These changes are consistent with direction from Manitoba Education and Early Learning. Ask your child's teacher if you need to clarify the change.

In November, we will have a Remembrance Day service in the gym. The service will focus on the theme of Canada's role in UN Peacekeeping efforts, the "blue helmets."

We are working together at Luxton to share clear, consistent and positive expectations for student behaviour. For the new play structure at the front of the school, we shared with students ways to be **respectful** (e.g., leave wood chips on the ground, keep hands and feet to self (especially in hamster hole)), **responsible** (e.g., call an adult if you find something sharp), and **mindful** (e.g., take turns on the new twirly thingamajig).



UPCOMING DAYCARE CLOSURE – NOV. 13

For those parents with students in the Mary Kardash Daycare, please note that the centre will be closed on Monday, November 13th. There will be no before and after school care for children that day, and no lunch supervision. However, the school is open that day. If you normally have children in before and after school care, please remember that on November 13:

- Do not drop children off before 8:45 AM (9:15 AM for Nursery Kindergarten)
- Pick up children for lunch at 11:45 AM and return for the afternoon at 12:40 PM
- Pick up grades 1 6 children at 3:30 PM

Sounds like a great opportunity to take the family out for lunch!



Instructions for Parents/Guardians:

Safe Arrival is an absence reporting system that:

- makes it easy for you to report your child's absence
- . increases student safety by allowing staff to respond to unexplained absences more efficiently.

You are asked to report your child's absence using one of the following convenient methods:

Phone	1-855-278-4513	Call the toll-free, interactive telephone system.
Website	https://go.schoolmessenger.ca	Set up your Parent Portal account then log in.
Mobile App		Set up your Parent Portal account, download the Apple or Android app, then log in.

Planned absences may be reported in advance.

All methods are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

If you report an absence before the 9:00 AM morning bell time on the morning of the absence you will not receive a call in the morning.

We will be using the School Messenger automated notification system to contact parents/guardians if a child is absent and the absence was not reported in advance. SchoolMessenger attempts to contact parents/guardians at multiple contact numbers until the designated contact(s) is/are reached.

If you report your child absent using the toll-free number, Parent Portal website or Safe Arrival app, you will not receive these calls.

Using the Parent Portal website, you may also update your login information and review messages sent through School Messenger.

GRADE 5/6 AT INNER CITY SCIENCE CENTRE!

I am passionate about the work of Dr Gordon Neufeld & Dr Gabor Maté. Their book, *Hold On To Your Kids*, talks about the importance of transferring the caregiver attachment to everyone that is caring for our children: babysitters, extra-curricular activity instructors, daycare providers, teachers, extended family, etc. What they're saying is that children need us – parents and teachers – to model trusting, positive relationships: greeting one another warmly, learning each other's names, asking about the weekend, wishing



one another a great day.

From the bus driver, to the daycare staff, to the school personnel, let children witness a warm transfer of attachment wherever possible. Children need to see the adults who care for and teach them modelling warmth to feel a sense of security.
