We will continue working with our guided reading groups during Daily 5 and practice our spelling using different literacy programs to further our knowledge and understanding! We first looked through different non-fiction books that gave us a lot of information about different animals. After choosing an animal that we wanted to learn about, we began the research process by looking through the book and taking notes in our own words! We learnt about the different types of habitats that animals live in and if they are a carnivore, herbivore, or omnivore. We had lots of fun creating the dioramas and were very excited to showcase them at Student Led!




GRADES 5, 6 - ROOM 211 | MR. TOSCZAK
