GRADES 1, 2 - ROOM 208 | MS. CELESTINO

Last month was "Love Month" February and it was also I LOVE TO READ MONTH. We reached our school goal and read 100 books per classroom this month! The students in Room 208 participated in every Wednesday dress-up day by dressing up and truly tried their best to read at least 3-5 books each day. Here's last month's recap! In Math, we started practicing more addition and subtraction strategies to make math more fun and engaging. We also played a math games in grouped stations where we practiced: number line, number bond, dice math game, and rainbow to 10. In Dreambox, we practiced analyzing word problem strategies. In ELA, lots of reading and practicing some sight words. We are also learning more styles of poetry. In Science, we are learning about the sources of water in the environment and why water is so important to living and non-living things. In Social Studies, we are learning about our community and Indigenous ways of learning. Lasly, in Art class, we have a sketchbook for everyone to free-draw. Here, students are encouraged to draw whenever they feel sad, happy, and excited. The drawing book is within their reach in the classroom that also connects with topics taught in the Health curriculum.

Afterwards, we read the original news article to figure out what the picture was really about!
