


REMEMBRANCE DAY coming up this month

GRADES 1, 2 - ROOM 208 | MS. CELESTINO

It has been a FALL-tastic learning month for the grade 1s and 2s this October. In Math, we are all thrilled to start our math drill in addition and subtraction. Everyone is actively participating with our number of the day, all are having fun using the whiteboard to share their answers. In ELA, we are making good progress in reading more books. We have started with our reading reflections, lots of discussions about the book and sharing their prior knowledge and life experiences. We also started our spelling quiz. Special thanks to Mr. Mills who would prepare some word work for the students during our Daily 5 rotations. In Science, we are learning about weather, seasons, the sun and the rainbow. In Social Studies, we are learning about Canada, locating our city and province on the map, as well as symbols, languages we speak and the beauty of being diverse as a country. Lastly, in Art class we are currently learning about lines and colours. We have done some paper crafts, kudos to room 211 (our reading buddies) for helping our grade 1s and 2s make creative crafts and for helping with writing their thank you letter for the people they love and value on Thanksgiving Day.















GRADES 1, 2 - ROOM 209 | MS. TURNER

Room 209 has been settling into the classroom quite pleasantly and everyone has had a smooth transition! This term has been quite busy with learning new concepts and routines in the classroom. In ELA and specifically Daily 5, we have finally started our guided reading groups! Student's have really enjoyed having this time to work in small groups with myself and their classmates! Even though we are still practicing our counting skills and the understanding of numbers, we have also started our patterns unit! We have wrapped up our Weathers and Seasons Science Inquiry Unit and now have started our Sense of Belonging Inquiry unit in Social Studies! October has been filled with many different Halloween activities such as working in groups to practice poems that we have learnt presented to the class, pumpkin art and creating our own Halloween stories to name a few!



GRADES 3, 4 - ROOM 212 | MS. DENISE

Room 212 is enjoying this fabulous fall weather! We went on an exploration walk in our neighbourhood and the students had interesting and lively observations about the different structures in our neighbourhood because we have been learning about materials and structures in Science. As a group, we have been experimenting building and testing structures in our classroom using a variety of objects such as dominos, paper, books and weights. In math, we are developing a variety of math skills such as addition, subtraction, working with money as well as strengthening our reading and writing skills. We are still reading The Wild Robot and are looking forward to finding out what kind of adventures Roz goes on. In Social Studies, we have been learning about our great country Canada and about our Rights and Responsibilities as Canadian Citizens. We have been learning about Canadian artist Norval Morisseau and the impact his art has had on the Canadian art scene. We had a lot of fun creating Norval Morrisseau inspired art which has been on display across the office in our school. GRADES 3, 4 - ROOM 214 | MRS. SIMONS

October was a fun and productive month for us! In ELA, we have been focusing on descriptive writing for the month, writing about different Fall or Halloween topics. Students are working on using details and writing about different character traits. We are also continuing with our weekly personal writing, Daily 5 (still building that Read to Self stamina!) and classroom novel, Matilda. In Math, we focused on Place Value, Mental Math strategies and Problem Solving. For the last week or so, we have been working on a Haunted Hotel Math project. Students have been working hard on perimeter and area, addition and subtraction, working with money and interpreting graphs. We are nearing the end of our first units in Social Studies. We have been learning about Canadian Geography and Connecting with Canadians. We recently started a new Science unit learning all about Materials and Structures. Students have been doing very well with planning and designing different structures and testing their theories on strength and stability using a variety of materials! We took advantage of the beautiful Fall weather and took Science outside! We went for a community walk for a Structure Hunt which was lots of fun! Zones and Regulation and different mindfulness activities have been our Health learning for the month of October. It was a great month!

GRADES 5, 6 - ROOM 211 | MR. TOSCZAK



Once again, we have had another busy, yet productive month in room 211. We are now in full gear, and it shows, as we continue to work very hard. In math we have been working on multiplication and patterns. We have been practicing our math facts and learning different strategies to solve more complex questions and problems. In ELA, we continue to work on our reading and writing skills through daily practice and have completed our Novel Study Coraline, which was a very creepy but interesting novel. Science has been exciting as we have learned so much about the Solar System. From asteroids, meteors, and comets to the 8 planets in our solar system, I can guarantee that we have improved our research skills. See you next month!

What a busy October! We had a lot of fun learning in our room this month. We began our next Novel Study, Kiki's Delivery Service. In Math, we continued to work on our Mental Math skills. Some of the skills were easy and some took some work on, but we have all gotten better. In Science, we started our unit on Space! We're having a lot of fun testing gravity, examining planets, and looking at the different phases of the moon.





COMMUNICATION BOARD visuals in our playground

The Prairie Rose playground has received a Playground Communication Board (PCB)! The symbols and phrases on our PCB allow for accessible communication for all our students and families in the community. The PCB was designed with inclusion in mind.

Many children face challenges in verbal communication, and a PCB provides an inclusive platform where they can share their thoughts, emotions, and needs. By incorporating this resource into outdoor play and communication, we create a welcoming environment that celebrates every child's communication style, helping them feel valued, getting their wants and needs met, and being included in their community. Let's support our children in connecting with the world around them!

You can point to the word on the board as you say it out loud, to model (or show) language that your student might want to use while at the playground. You can point to words on the PCB as you speak. We should model comments and thoughts, rather than just asking lots of questions.

PROCEDURES / EXPECTATIONS

Prairie Rose School Parent Council oversees the Lunch Program at the school in coordination with the principal, Mrs. Manzano. The Lunch Program follows all regulations and policies as outlined by the school and Winnipeg School Division.

The Lunch Program's supervisor, **Kim Cychowski**, recognizes that the safety and well-being of all students over the lunch hour is of the utmost importance. The Lunch Program is a non-profit organization. The lunch fees are used to pay the wages of adult lunch supervisors who provide indoor and outdoor supervision during the lunch hour.

Children are expected to bring a lunch. Please make sure that lunch is carried to school in a strong bag and all items are labeled with your child's name and room number. Milk is provided by the program and is subsidized by the school. Every child is encouraged to have milk at lunch. Microwave service is not provided. Children are supervised during the 12:00-12:55 p.m. lunch period. Children eat their lunch from 12:00 p.m. to approximately 12:30 p.m., at which time they will be supervised on the playground (weather permitting), or dismissed to noon hour clubs. Inside activities will occur during inclement weather.

NORWEST DAYCARE

NorWest's Early Learning Childcare Centre is a non-profit child care centre licensed through Manitoba Early Learning and Child Care. We have been in operation for more than 40 years. We have two sites: our Lucas Ave location is licensed to accept 66 children aged 1-12 years (4 infant, 32 preschool and 30 school age) and our Keewatin location is licensed to accept 12 infants (age 3 months to 24 months). Both sites are open throughout the week from 7:00 am – 5:00 pm except statutory holidays.

We recognize each child as an individual with different interests, strengths, and levels of development. Our team of certified Early Childhood Educators and assistants deliver age-appropriate activities aimed to enhance a child's social, emotional and physical development. We also help your child build strong cognitive, language, motor, and self-help skills.
