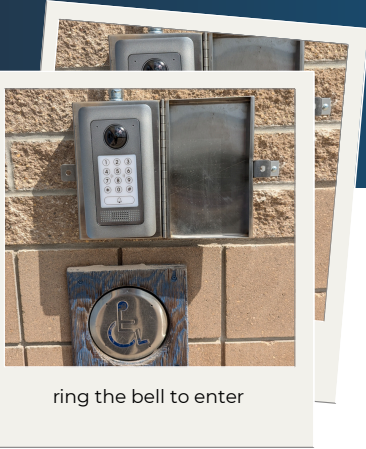

PROCEDURES / EXPECTATIONS

Welcome to a new school year. With our updated exterior doors' security system, doors will be locked at all times. We will continue to use designated doors to help with movement in and out of the school as follows:

- Nursery & Kindergarten - Torwood Crescent front doors
- Grades 1, 2, 3 - Lucas Avenue bus loop doors
- Grades 4, 5, 6 - Chisholm Drive side doors

If your child is late or entering the school after 9:15 a.m., please use the Lucas Avenue (bus loop) doors.

Families can drop off all children at one door with the older sibling entering with the younger sibling(s) if needed.

Please use caution and follow all traffic laws to ensure students are safe during drop-off and pick-up times.



SAFE ARRIVAL / TRANSPORTATION

Please note that all students who are not in attendance at school during any given day are part of the school-wide call back system. Teachers report the names of children who are absent and if the parent of the absent child has not called the Safe Arrival Call-in System at 1-855-278-4513 to report their absence, they will be notified by phone regarding their child/ren absence by an automated system. In order to ensure the safety of our students, it is imperative that parents/guardians notify the school of any absences or late arrivals. Students who arrive at school late are instructed to report to the office first before going to their classroom.

If your child is bussed to school, please call your bus provider as soon as possible at 204-586-8800 (opens at 6:30 a.m.) You can also call Transportation Department at 204-789-0452 or Wheelchair Services at 204-982-0799.

Should your child/ren need to leave the school early for any reason, please send a note to the teacher with the date and time of departure. Please indicate who will be picking up your child. An adult is required to sign your child out in the office before leaving the school.

If challenges persist, contact the Board and Community Liaison Officer at 204-789-0469. They work with families and the Board of Trustees to reach a solution.

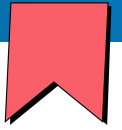

WSD Ward Boundaries Survey

At a meeting held June 16, 2025, the Board of Trustees approved a motion to hold a public consultation meeting and survey families regarding revisions to WSD Ward Boundaries that will come into effect October 28, 2026.

A public consultation meeting will be held on **September 24, 2025 from 5:00 to 6:00 pm at Technical Vocational High School, 1555 Wall Street**. The public is invited to learn more about the revisions to ward boundaries and the results of the survey.

What is a ward boundary?

A ward boundary defines the geographic area that each elected trustee represents within Winnipeg School Division. Each ward encompasses a specific family of schools and neighbourhoods, ensuring that all areas of the division have representation on the Board of Trustees.

Why is WSD adjusting ward boundaries?

Ward boundaries are being adjusted to ensure equitable representation of all communities within WSD. As population shifts occur across the city, rebalancing the wards helps maintain fair and effective representation on the Board of Trustees. This supports more responsive governance and decision-making that reflects the needs of all families.

When will the new ward boundaries take effect?

The new ward boundaries will come into effect following the City of Winnipeg municipal election in the fall of 2026. At that time, the newly elected WSD Board of Trustees will represent the updated boundaries.

Will this impact where my student is currently attending school?

No. These changes will not affect school catchment areas or student registration processes. The ward boundary adjustments are solely related to governance and representation.

How will this improve student learning?

While the ward boundary changes do not directly alter student learning, they enhance the WSD governance structure by ensuring that each trustee represents a balanced number of schools and families. This leads to more equitable advocacy and oversight, helping trustees better address the unique needs of each community, which ultimately supports improved educational outcomes.

Why don't the new ward boundaries follow major roads or familiar neighbourhood lines?

Winnipeg School Division must align its ward boundaries with the Voting Subdivision Boundaries (VSDs) established by the City of Winnipeg. These subdivisions are used during municipal elections and help ensure accurate voter counts and fair representation.

How were the new ward boundaries chosen?

New ward boundary options were selected to meet several key criteria, ensuring fair and balanced representation across the division. These factors support effective trustee representation and manageable ward sizes:

- Even distribution of total population per ward (based on 2021 Census data)
- Voter counts within the 25% variance limit set out in The Public Schools Act
- Balanced student population in each ward
- Logical grouping of schools, with 7 to 11 elementary schools and 1 to 2 high schools per ward
- Representation of 1 to 4 City Councillors per WSD ward.

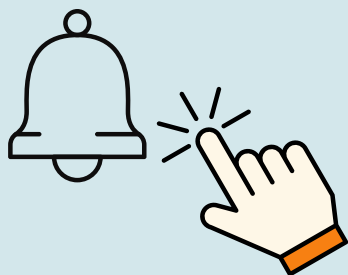

Security Cameras in Schools



Keeping our students, staff, parents and visitors safe in Winnipeg School Division schools is a top priority. One way we do this is by monitoring areas in schools (eg. entrances, hallways and school buses) using security cameras.

Security cameras are used to monitor WSD property to assist in detecting and deterring unacceptable behavior or activities, and to assist investigations when required. WSD has put in place a detailed policy about the collection, use, protection, retention and/or disclosure of information captured on security cameras with the provisions of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Personal Privacy Act (FIPPA), the Personal Health Information Act (PHIA), the Youth Criminal Justice Act, as well as WSD Policy EGC – Records Management and Retention.

Each year, September 30 marks the **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation**. The day honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process. Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day take place on September 30.

Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of “Every Child Matters”. The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

NORWEST DAYCARE

NorWest's Early Learning Childcare Centre is a non-profit child care centre licensed through Manitoba Early Learning and Child Care. We have been in operation for more than 40 years. We have two sites: our Lucas Ave location is licensed to accept 66 children aged 1-12 years (4 infant, 32 preschool and 30 school age) and our Keewatin location is licensed to accept 12 infants (age 3 months to 24 months). Both sites are open throughout the week from 7:00 am – 5:00 pm except statutory holidays.

We recognize each child as an individual with different interests, strengths, and levels of development. Our team of certified Early Childhood Educators and assistants deliver age-appropriate activities aimed to enhance a child's social, emotional and physical development. We also help your child build strong cognitive, language, motor, and self-help skills.

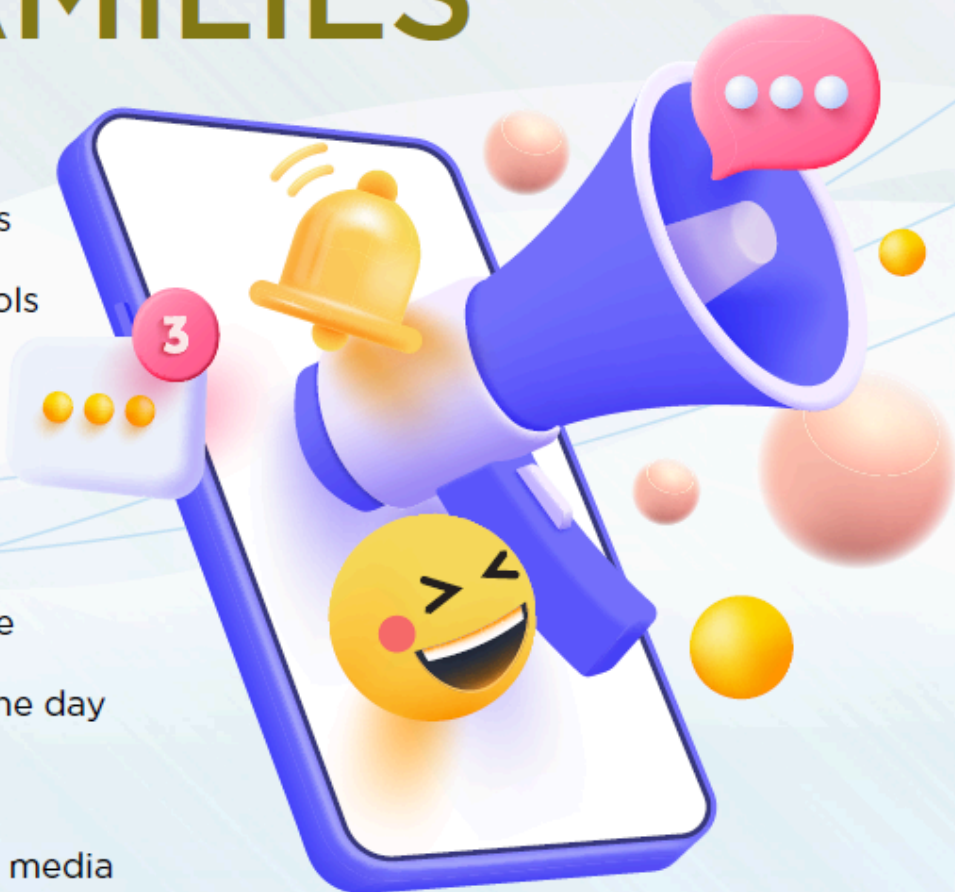




REMINDERS

CELL PHONE TIPS FOR FAMILIES

- Turn off screens and remove them from bedrooms 30 to 60 minutes before bedtime
- Learn about parental controls
- Provide clear limits
- Designate some times and places as no-device zones
- Maximize in-person activity and sleep, rather than focusing on total screen hours
- Provide experiences outside with other children
- Provide clear structure to the day and week
- Look for signs of addiction and problematic use
- Delay the opening of social media accounts until 16
- Coordinate with other families to create community expectations
- Talk with your child about the risks, and listen to their thoughts
- Talk to your child's teacher and principal and support the new provincial direction on mobile devices
