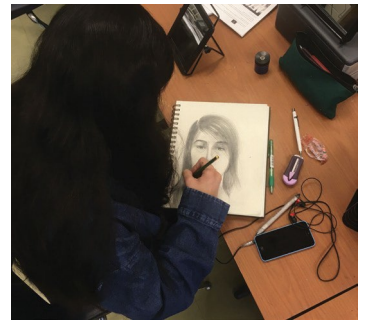

CARPENTRY

Post-grad Industry Training Program

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

Students will develop the basic skills required for employment or post-secondary education in the Carpentry trade. Students in the Carpentry Program will be instructed in the use of a wide variety of techniques associated with the major areas of the building construction industry, in Carpentry, Woodworking, Concrete and Drywall. Ongoing safety practices in the proper use and safe operation of tools and equipment used in the industry are emphasized.

WHO THIS PROGRAM IS FOR

Candidates for this program are interested in finding employment in the Building Construction Field. Graduates of the Carpentry Program are well prepared to continue their studies at a post-secondary technical college, to enter an apprenticeship program, or to compete for jobs in the construction trade.

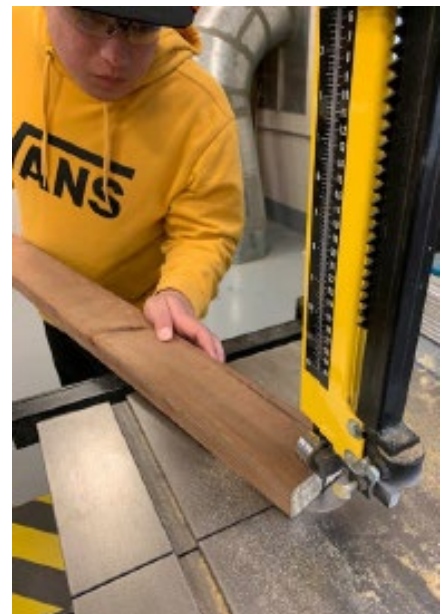

CHILD CARE ASSISTANT

Post-grad Industry Training Program

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

The Child Care Assistant Program has been developed to prepare students for a career in the Early Child Care field. Upon successful completion of the program, the student will demonstrate a variety of employability skills in order to obtain an entry-level position.

WHO THIS PROGRAM IS FOR

The CCA Program is designed for individuals who have an interest in the field of Child Care and would like to work with children ages 12 weeks to 12 years, or those interested in working as Educational Assistants or opening their own home centers.

Students will need to provide a clean Criminal Record Check and Child Abuse/Vulnerable Persons Record Check.

CULINARY ARTS

Post-grad Industry Training Program

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

The Culinary Arts Pre-Industry Training program is designed to develop entry-level food preparation skills and give students the practical experience necessary to enter the cook trade of the food service industry with confidence.

WHO THIS PROGRAM IS FOR

Candidates for this program are interested in entry level employment in the Food Services Industry. The Culinary Arts Program curriculum has been developed, in consultation with industry, to provide students with trade specific skills, job readiness training, and real-world work experience that offers students the potential for future full-time employment.

PROGRAM COST:

\$150.00 for textbook rental, and food handlers course for all students for students living within the Winnipeg School Division.*

CERTIFICATION OFFERED:

Students earn a Culinary Arts certificate. This course also provides students with the opportunity to challenge the Level 1 Apprenticeship theory.

THE PROGRAM:

Red Seal certified instructors with many years of industry experience running high volume establishments will guide you in developing the necessary work habits and skills sought after by industry employers. This program has a high success rate of students getting hired upon graduation.

Students will gain experience in the following types of services: banquets, buffets, a la carte, and catering. Students will navigate through such productions as: meat, seafood, poultry, soup, sauces, baking, garde manger, cost control, menu planning, and inventory management.

GRAPHIC DESIGN

Post-grad Industry Training Program

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

To prepare students for gaining entry-level employment or to prepare them for the Graphic Design program at Red River College (or other post-secondary institutions), including the preparation and submission of an entrance portfolio and application.

WHO THIS PROGRAM IS FOR

Candidates for this program are either interested in exploring graphic design as a potential career or are already planning to apply to a post-secondary graphic design program and require coaching and support in creating their portfolio. Students do not need to have a graphic design background before entering this program, but should have some previous experience with fine art, drawing, and/or digital media creation. Basic computers skills are required to be successful.

HAIRSTYLING

Post-grad Industry Training Program

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

The accredited Hairstyling Adult program consists of 12 credits, which prepare students for salon employment as an apprentice for the Hairstyling industry or other career options related to this field. Students must attain a 70% average in both theory and practical components to challenge the government practical exam.

WHO THIS PROGRAM IS FOR

The Hairstyling Program is designed for students who enjoy meeting and talking with people, and working creatively with their hands. A successful career in Hairstyling requires an artistic imagination, strong customer service skills, employability skills and the ability to stand for extended periods of time. Students will need to provide a clean Criminal Record Check, Child Abuse Record Check and grade 12 equivalent or mature student status.

HEALTH CARE AIDE

Post-grad Industry Training Program

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

The Health Care Aide program is designed to provide students with the practical and theoretical skills necessary to assist clients with their physical and emotional needs throughout all stages of life in a compassionate and competent manner. Self-reflection and critical thinking skills are emphasized throughout the course.

WHO THIS PROGRAM IS FOR

People who are interested in caring for others, are compassionate and patient, good problem solvers and want to learn the skills necessary to enter the health care field. Students need to be over 18, have a clean criminal record check (vulnerable sector), adult and child abuse record check, have completed grade 12 and IELTS level of 6 or CLB of level 7. Immunizations must be up to date before clinical.

SEQUENCE OF THE YEAR:

September to January

The first five months of the course are divided between the classroom and the HCA lab to allow students to obtain the preliminary knowledge and skills needed to begin their clinical experience. The certificates required by Winnipeg Regional Health Authority for clinical will be completed during this time.

February to June

Students begin their clinical experience. They will have the opportu-

nity to do three different placements in hospitals and long-term care facilities for three days a week. On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday they will attend clinical from approximately 7 am to 3:30 pm. They will gain practical experience working directly with clients, while partnered with a HCA staff member.

The other two days in the week, Thursday and Friday, will be in the classroom from 9am to 2:20 pm continuing with theory.

HORTICULTURE

Post-grad Industry Training Program

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

The Horticulture Program provides students with the basic foundation in the growing and popular field of Horticulture and Landscape Horticulture. Students will have opportunities to develop a working knowledge and to practice their skills in our greenhouses, on the school grounds and in various work sites, farms, and school mentor- ships in the community.

WHO THIS PROGRAM IS FOR

Candidates for this program are interested in the science of plant life (botany), caring for and designing with plants and learning related skills such as greenhouse maintenance, plant propagation, masonry and floristry. Students enjoy working both indoors and outdoors. Upon successful completion students will have the skills to enter entry-level positions in Horticulture fields and become environmentally conscious individuals.

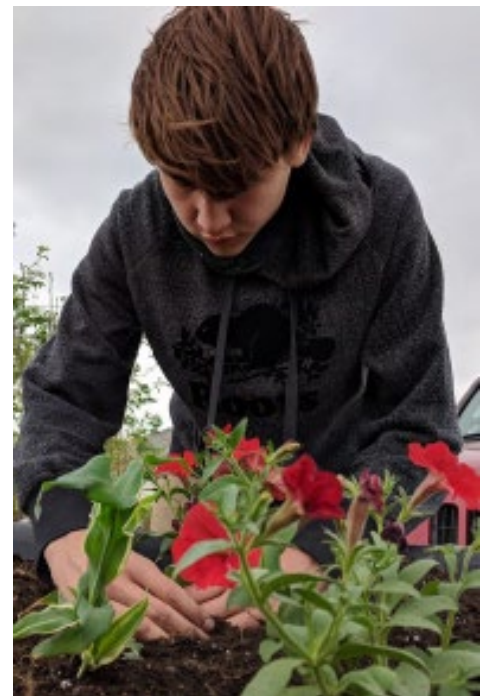

Candidates for the program are interested in mathematical, written, oral, problem solving skills and the ability to see projects through to completion. An interest in computer skills and the ability to design will be helpful
