Each day, we have several buses, shuttles and taxis that are dropping off or picking up students at our bus loop. We kindly ask that vehicles enter the bus loop from the Rec Centre side and exit by the corner of Machray Ave and Andrews St. Also, please keep to the curb side and avoid stopping directly in front of the doors between 8:30 and 9:00, 11:30-1:00 and 3:00-3:45. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

There has been some confusion regarding supervision responsibilities for students who attend Machray Daycare that are going to the Breakfast program at the Rec Centre. In conversation with Manreet and the davcare staff, we agreed that those students who attend Machray Daycare will go to the daycare rooms when they arrive and they will be provided breakfast there. All other students will attend the Breakfast Program at the Rec Centre. Please know that the Rec Centre doors will open at 8:30 am. 
