Vice-Principal's Message

Dear Families:

It's hard to believe it is already December and we are nearing the end of 2024. November at Ralph Brown School was a month of celebration and reflection of our learning. We appreciated connecting with families during parent-student-teacher conferences and celebrating your child's learning. Please know that you do not need to wait until conference times to discuss your child's learning. You are welcome to contact your child's teacher anytime by phone or email.

Our Scholastic Book Fair took place during the conference times and was well received by all who came to browse and purchase some great reading material. We sold over \$2000 worth of books which allowed the school to purchase \$265 worth of books for our school library. Thank you, families!

Last month our students represented our school at many sporting activities. The school has been buzzing with intramurals over the lunch hour, intercity soccer at U of W, and triple ball volleyball at neighbouring WSD schools. Our dedicated coaches/ teachers have ensured that students can play, learn the rules of the game, have fun, and bringing home a few wins has been an added bonus. Congratulations to all our Rocket players!

On November 8th, staff and students gathered for our Remembrance Day Service and honoured Indigenous Veterans Day. It gave us time to pause and consider past and present wars and what our Armed Services do to protect our freedom. Our theme this year was "Pathway to Peace". Classes contributed to a school-wide art collaboration by sharing words and images of steps that we all can take towards promoting peace.

On November 29th we also held another day of remembrance. Holodomor was a manmade famine that killed millions of people in Ukrainian between 1932-1933. We continue to remember to ensure that this tragedy is not forgotten, as it is the best hope against

history repeating itself. Our grade seven students in the English-Ukrainian Bilingual Program will be visiting the Human Rights Museum in early December where they will be attending the Holodomor and Indigenous History Experience organized by Manitoba Parents for Ukrainian Education.

As the cold weather comes, we want to remind families and students to dress appropriately for the snow and cold. Outdoor play is a very important part of learning during the day. We have a limited amount of winter clothing that was donated to the school that we use as extras if students forget or need items. Students go outside for 15 minutes in the morning, 30 minutes over the lunch time, and 15 minutes in the afternoon. As stated on the WSD website, students stay indoors for recess when the wind chill reaches -28 degrees Celsius. School bus transportation for all school divisions in the City of Winnipeg is cancelled if: the actual temperature is -35°C (regardless of windchill) based on the 6:00 a.m. Environment Canada reading at the Forks, Winnipeg or; if the wind chill reaches -45°C (regardless of air temperature) based on the 6:00 a.m. Environment Canada readings at the Forks, Winnipeg. The temperature and windchill readings can be found at the Environment Canada website.

The Parent Advisory Council has kicked of their Winter Calendar fundraiser! Calendars are \$5 each and with each purchase your name will be entered into a draw for monetary prizes. Sales have been going very well and calendars can still be purchased throughout the month of December. Draws begin on December 2nd. Good luck to all!

Our Ukrainian Program teachers have been preparing for the arrival of St. Nicholas this month! He will be arriving on Friday, December 6. All students will be treated to songs and treats. We are excited to continue this long-standing tradition at Ralph Brown School! Also on this day, a perogy lunch will take place for all students free of charge. Please return forms to school to know how many perogies we need to boil!

Our younger classes will entertain you on Wednesday, December 18 @ 6:30 pm, while our intermediate students will perform on Thursday, December 19 @ 6:30 pm. 
Lastly, we want to wish you all the best for this holiday season and hope you have a restful winter break. School starts
