Principal's Message

Dear Families,

What a joy it is to be part of this school community. There are so many great opportunities for students, staff and families here and we have much to be thankful for. We continue to provide Nature Based Learning for our primary students which means they get to learn from and in nature to support their learning of math, science, literacy and social studies. Staff continue to work with our division Literacy Mentor Coach and Math Mental Coach to develop their knowledge and skills in these subject areas. Mr. Karpenko has been working hard to provide sport based extra-curricular activities for students including the inner-city soccer league, basketball teams and hosting games at the school as well as the skate club. A special shout out to Mr. Fraser for volunteering to coach the boys' basketball team. On that note, we also want to thank the dozen or so parents, grandparents and guardians who responded to an email to help PAC with the pizza lunch. We appreciate you and hope to find more ways to volunteer here because you are part of this school community. The English-Ukrainian Bilingual program continues to grow. We welcomed about 200 students, family members and special guests involved in the program to the annual Ukrainian Christmas dinner. his would not have been possible without the support of parent volunteers and our dedicated staff. We also want acknowledge the food donations from No Frills on Main Street and Gunn's Bakery as well as the parents who donated backed goods. Students in grades 4-8 were also invited to take part in DI (Destination Imagination) both on a competitive level or a lunch hour club experience. This is part of our STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math) programming. This is led by our fabulous staff who give their own time to provide this great opportunity for students.

As previously shared earlier this month, we welcomed Monica Sim as the new Vice Principal of Ralph Brown. This time last year, I reported that we had 280 students and now we currently have 358! This is incredible as it is not just our bilingual program that is growing. Our English program is growing too and we are glad to welcome new students and families that want to be a part of this amazing school community. Thank you to all the families for making Ralph Brown School the place to be and learn. We still have more space to grow yet! With that said, we will be hosting our annual Open House on Wednesday. February 21st from 6:00 – 7:00 pm. Families interested in knowing more about the programming available at Ralph Brown can join us virtually for a Question and Response format. Please call the school office for a virtual invite and link to the meeting. If you know of a family interested in attending Ralph Brown for the next school year, please have them call us for more information. We are now accepting registrations for new Nursery, Kindergarten, and Grade 1 students who have not attended school yet. Parents/guardians have the option to enroll their children in the English program (N-6) or take advantage of the benefits of learning a second language by enrolling them in the Ukrainian Bilingual *Program (K-8).* This would be a great opportunity for students new to Kindergarten or grade 1 to take advantage of learning Ukrainian among current newcomers as they work at learning English. New registrations for all grade levels are also being accepted at this time. Please call the school or visit our website for more information.

This is also the time of year we start to look at planning for next year. This includes school priorities, goals, programming, enrolment, and budget. As a member of the school community, we welcome families to share their thoughts, concerns and questions with us as we strive to meet the needs of our students, families and community the best way we can. One way to do this is to join our Parent Council meetings each month. We meet in person in our library or via a teams meeting link for those who wish to join us virtually. Please join us on Tuesday, February 13^h at 6:00 pm.

With the warmer temperatures here at this unusual time, we want to remind families ensure children are coming to school dressed appropriately for the weather. We request that all students come to school with boots, hats and gloves so that they can stay warm during recess. We remind students daily to wear all of their outdoor clothing items that families have sent them to school in. Our supply of gently used mittens/ gloves that have been donated for students who are in need is getting very low. If you have any gently used mittens/gloves that you would like to donate to the school, you can drop them off at the office.

We are still in need of a few parent volunteers to help operate the breakfast programming. We have the space, the food, and the need but need people resources. If you are able to donate your time from 8:15 to 9:00 in the morning, we would love to hear from you. When this is able to be supported by volunteers, students would be welcome to come into the Rec Centre from 8:30-8:50 am. Students will be offered cereal, toast, or fruit and be supervised by the parent volunteers. Students are expected to behave appropriately and clean up after themselves.

Looking forward we will be having student led conferences in March and we are starting to plan for an overnight camp experience for our students in grades 5-8. More information will be sent out soon. It is never a dull moment here at Ralph Brown. I encourage you to talk with your child about their day at school and learning experiences. If you have questions, wonderings or suggestions, please feel free to contact your child's teacher, Mrs. Sim or myself. I am happy to hear any concerns you may have, but I also encourage you to share any positive feedback about your child's progress, programming or staff.


BOWLING
